The Gospel

John 2:1-11

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John.

Glory to you, O Lord.

On the third day there was a wedding in Cana of Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there. Jesus and his disciples had also been invited to the wedding. When the wine gave out, the mother of Jesus said to him, 'They have no wine.' And Jesus said to her, 'Woman, what concern is that to you and to me? My hour has not yet come.' His mother said to the servants, 'Do whatever he tells you.' Now standing there were six stone water-jars for the Jewish rites of purification, each holding twenty or thirty gallons. Jesus said to them, 'Fill the jars with water.' And they filled them up to the brim. He said to them, 'Now draw some out, and take it to the chief steward.' So they took it. When the steward tasted the water that had become wine, and did not know where it came from (though the servants who had drawn the water knew), the steward called the bridegroom and said to him, 'Everyone serves the good wine first, and then the inferior wine after the guests have become drunk. But you have kept the good wine until now.' Jesus did this, the first of his signs, in Cana of Galilee, and revealed his glory; and his disciples believed in him.

This is the Gospel of the Lord.

Reflection *by Revd Steve Dunton*

One of the absolute joys in the life of the Abbey are our weddings, everyone loves a good wedding, the first glimpse of the bride with the groom and best man sat expectantly awaiting her grand entrance, the bells, the music and confetti. Sadly, over the past year most of our weddings have had to be postponed due to the pandemic. Our hearts go out to the couples and their families who have been affected and hope that they can have their weddings soon.

In today's gospel, Jesus is the guest at a wedding- the best kind of guest you can wish for. For anyone who's ever organised a wedding, a guest who can turn water into wine is a considerable boon. In the Scriptures, wine represents joy, a symbol of the yearned for messianic age.

Jesus performs this miracle by using what was at hand, the six large ceremonial jars of water each containing 20-30 gallons of water filled to the brim, turning them into wine. Jewish weddings could last three days or more, but this is an immense amount of wine for the occasion.

Normally it was the bridegroom who was expected to provide the wine. Here Jesus shows us that he is the true bridegroom and we his church are his bride. God lavishes upon us his grace and love that overflow beyond measure. God is never stingy with us but always shows his extravagance. Jesus wants to perform miracles in our lives too, turning the receptacles of our stone-cold hearts into containers for the new wine of the kingdom, overflowing with joy.

How then can we experience this nuptial joy that Jesus, the bridegrooms wants to give us? The clue is found in the gospel when Mary says to the stewards at the wedding banquet, 'Do whatever he tells you.' When we live our lives by Christ's teachings, having the gospel in our hearts, then we shall have life in all its fullness.

An extract from a message from Bishop John, 8 January 2021

“It might feel as though we have been in the season of Lent for a very long time. Because of the pandemic we weren’t able to celebrate Easter properly last year and the remainder of the year had a distinctly penitential feel to it, as has the first part of 2021.

This year, at the end of what feels like a very long Lent, it would be good for us to reflect upon and pray about what the ‘new normal’ might look like. I hope it will involve more care, more community, more goodness and more Godliness – but God will work things out much more wonderfully than I could ever plan.”

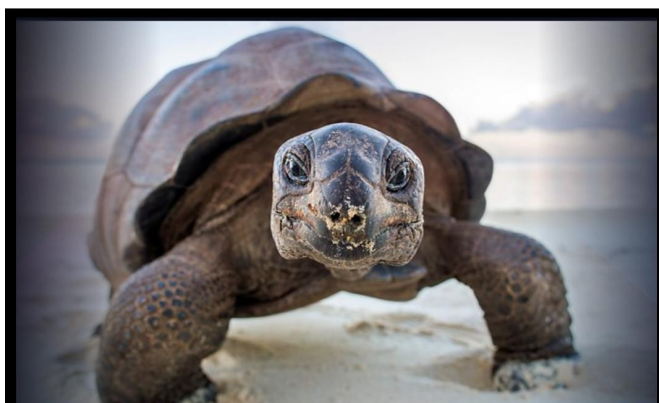

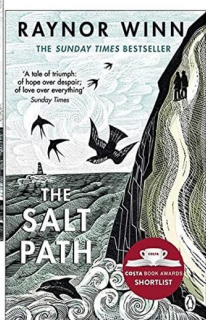
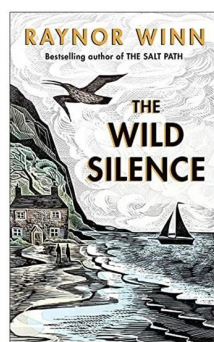

PERSHORE ABBEY PUT ON THE MAP AS A "ROOFBREAKER": WHAT IS ALL THIS ABOUT?

The term 'Roofbreaker' comes from the story in Luke 5 about the paralysed man coming to Jesus 'Through the Roof' - "they went up on the roof and lowered the paralysed man on his mat into the middle of the crowd, right in front of Jesus".

Over recent years, before Covid struck, the Abbey has reduced practical barriers for those living with disability, both outside and inside the church – removing the steps outside the west door (replaced with a slope), adding safe ramps inside the church, making sure there are spaces for wheelchairs, providing large print, cream orders of service and introducing a loop system and quiet spaces. We have welcomed allcomers at services and visitors during the week, including groups of blind or deaf children, people who are sad, anxious, have dementia, autism or other mental health issues and who love to come over and over again.



Roofbreakers aim to break down the barriers faced by people with any disability, listening to them and responding to the issues that arise in churches and elsewhere, working to enable **Inclusion, Participation, and Belonging**.
