Scripture: Ephesians 1 v 1-10

Reflection by Kate Bruce (taken from BRF Guidelines Notes)

The spiritual decision to be joyful, choosing to look to God's loving kindness in all circumstances- cannot help but feed into a hopeful attitude. Ephesians 1 is full of reasons to be hopeful for ourselves and for our society. God blesses us, chooses us, adopts us, redeems us and forgives us – lavishing grace upon us. How many people struggle on in despair, abandoned, afraid and alone, not knowing that God desires them, and that they are inherently precious? How many people feel lost, crippled with guilt, unaware that God seeks them and forgives them? How many people feel that the world is in chaos and there seems no order, no plan, no direction? Many people are unaware that God holds creation in his hands – and has a purpose for all things, however broken they seem to us.

It is easy to lose hope when we cease to locate the hope in Christ. When hope wavers, mission initiatives look flimsy, knocked out by a committee of bright ideas. Hope in Christ grounds us. It reminds us that we have a message deeply relevant to our culture: an invitation into relationship with God, an invitation to become more fully who we are called to be. When human rule, authority, power and dominion rage and clash, we can have confidence in God's power which raised Christ from death and seated him above all human agencies.

Now is the time for hearts to be enlightened and for a message of hope to sing out from Christian communities. That message needs earthing in practical ways; it is useless to speak theological truth without putting flesh on the words. It is no good assuring the lonely they are loved and never visiting them.

To allow cynicism, fear and despair to sound their discordant dirges unchallenged would be a colossal failure of mission. God invites the outsider, the broken, the grieving, the sinner and the saint to his table in a kingdom where there are no walls, no back rows, no second-class seats. This is the counter narrative to intolerance, isolationism and downright nastiness spun by agencies of evil. Aware of our frailties, we may not have much confidence in ourselves as God's agents, but we can have tremendous hope in God.

Time of Sharing:

Spend a few moments making a **list of reasons to see hope in today's world**, and another of ways which you feel **you demonstrate your hope in your daily life** and we will share some of these thoughts with one another as you feel able.

Song: Sisters and Brothers with one voice confirm your calling and rejoice:
each is God's child and each God's choice. Alleluia, Alleluia! Alleluia!

Strangers no more, but cherished friends, live as the body God intends,
sharing the love the Spirit sends. Alleluia! Alleluia! Alleluia!

Not, though, by wisdom, wealth or skill, nor by ourselves can we fulfil
what, for the world, is God's own will Alleluia! Alleluia! Alleluia!

Christ is the way. By him alone, seeds of the kingdom's life are sown,
patterns of heaven and earth are shown. Alleluia! Alleluia! Alleluia!

Then follow him through every day, fear not what crowds or critics say:
those on the move stir those who stay. Alleluia! Alleluia! Alleluia!

In factory, office, home or hall: where people struggle, strive or stall,
seek out and serve the Lord of all. Alleluia! Alleluia! Alleluia!

Seeking and serving, with one voice, confirm your calling and rejoice:
each is God's child and each God's choice. Alleluia! Alleluia! Alleluia!
