FIRST READING Exodus 33:7-11a

A reading from the Book of Exodus

Moses used to take the tent and pitch it outside the camp, far off from the camp; he called it the tent of meeting. And everyone who sought the Lord would go out to the tent of meeting, which was outside the camp. Whenever Moses went out to the tent, all the people would rise and stand, each of them, at the entrance of their tents and watch Moses until he had gone into the tent. When Moses entered the tent, the pillar of cloud would descend and stand at the entrance of the tent, and the Lord would speak with Moses. When all the people saw the pillar of cloud standing at the entrance of the tent, all the people would rise and bow down, all of them, at the entrance of their tents. Thus the Lord used to speak to Moses face to face, as one speaks to a friend.

SECOND READING 1 John 1

A reading from the First Letter of John

We declare to you what was from the beginning, what we have heard, what we have seen with our eyes, what we have looked at and touched with our hands, concerning the word of life – this life was revealed, and we have seen it and testify to it, and declare to you the eternal life that was with the Father and was revealed to us – we declare to you what we have seen and heard so that you also may have fellowship with us; and truly our fellowship is with the Father and with his Son Jesus Christ. We are writing these things so that our joy may be complete.

This is the message we have heard from him and proclaim to you, that God is light and in him there is no darkness at all. If we say that we have fellowship with him while we are walking in darkness, we lie and do not do what is true; but if we walk in the light as he himself is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus his Son cleanses us from all sin. If we say that we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us. If we confess our sins, he who is faithful and just will forgive us our sins and cleanse us from all unrighteousness. If we say that we have not sinned, we make him a liar, and his word is not in us.

THE GOSPEL

John 21:19b-25

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John

After this Jesus said to Peter, 'Follow me.'

Peter turned and saw the disciple whom Jesus loved following them; he was the one who had reclined next to Jesus at the supper and had said, 'Lord, who is it that is going to betray you?' When Peter saw him, he said to Jesus, 'Lord, what about him?' Jesus said to him, 'If it is my will that he remain until I come, what is that to you? Follow me!' So the rumour spread in the community that this disciple would not die. Yet Jesus did not say to him that he would not die, but, 'If it is my will that he remain until I come, what is that to you?'

This is the disciple who is testifying to these things and has written them, and we know that his testimony is true. But there are also many other things that Jesus did; if every one of them were written down, I suppose that the world itself could not contain the books that would be written.

This is the Gospel of the Lord. **Praise to you, O Christ.**

A REFLECTION BY REVD STEVE DUNTON

"The Word was made flesh and dwelt amongst us,"- This most powerful sentence is at the heart of the Christmas message, written by the Apostle John, whose Feast we celebrate today. John and his brother James, the sons of Zebedee were nicknamed by Jesus "the sons of thunder." John, known as the Beloved Disciple, was a privileged witness to the Transfiguration. It was John who reclined on Jesus' breast at the Last Supper, showing just how much he loved his dear friend, who was also his Master. It was to John, that Jesus entrusted the care of his blessed mother and John was the only one of the twelve disciples to remain faithful to Christ at the foot of the cross.

Just before today's gospel begins, Peter, following his denial of Christ, is restored to his friendship and told that his destiny was to be a shepherd of Christ's flock and that he would die a martyr's death. Peter wonders about John's future, 'Lord, what about him?' Peter's wounded humanity once again comes to the fore. We all too readily compare ourselves to others, sometimes envying another person's journey of discipleship. Like Peter, we need to learn that we all have our own unique relationship with Jesus, so that there is no need to compare ourselves with others, as God loves us with an equal measure.

In his Gospel and throughout his life, John revealed the depth and richness of God's love revealed in Christ, which is at the heart of the Trinity. John becomes a model disciple not only in his fidelity but in showing us how to love and trust Christ. John teaches us to lean on Jesus' bosom, close to his divine heart, to drink deeply of his love, a love for us that will never end. Amen.

OTHER NEWS

<u>RESET THE DEBT CAMPAIGN</u>: Launched by the Baptist Union, the Church of Scotland, Church Action on Poverty, the Methodist Church and the United Reformed Church. The campaign grew out of listening and learning from communities during the lockdown of 2020. The project heard that debt was becoming an increasing problem for households and communities across the UK.

In the UK an estimated 6 million people, who were only just managing previously, incurred an extra £10- 12 billion in debt due to COVID and lockdown, whilst the better off saved £25 billion in lockdown and were less likely to be furloughed or lose their job. Reset the debt asks us to contact your MP with a Reset the Debt bauble and letter, calling for a Debt Jubilee.
