THE COLLECT

Loving God, you sent your Son to be part of a human family. Strengthen us as we share family life together, in our homes and in our church, through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

FIRST READING

Exodus 2:1-10

A reading from the Book of Exodus

A man from the house of Levi went and married a Levite woman. The woman conceived and bore a son; and when she saw that he was a fine baby, she hid him for three months. When she could hide him no longer she got a papyrus basket for him, and plastered it with bitumen and pitch; she put the child in it and placed it among the reeds on the bank of the river. His sister stood at a distance, to see what would happen to him. The daughter of Pharaoh came down to bathe at the river, while her attendants walked beside the river. She saw the basket among the reeds and sent her maid to bring it. When she opened it, she saw the child. He was crying, and she took pity on him, 'This must be one of the Hebrews' children,' she said. Then his sister said to Pharaoh's daughter, 'Shall I go and get you a nurse from the Hebrew women to nurse the child for you?'

Pharaoh's daughter said to her, 'Yes.' So the girl went and called the child's mother. Pharaoh's daughter said to her, 'Take this child and nurse it for me, and I will give you your wages.' So the woman took the child and nursed it. When the child grew up, she brought him to Pharaoh's daughter, and she took him as her son. She named him Moses, 'because,' she said, 'I drew him out of the water.'

REFLECTION BY REVD STEVE DUNTON

I've been watching a 'Star Wars' spin off lately called the Mandalorian. It features a tough bounty hunter called 'Mando' charged with abducting a small, green and cute little creature called 'Grogu,' who is a child. Mando hands the child over for money but he then rescues him from almost certain doom because the child has melted his heart, revealing a warm motherly nature.

Mando risks everything to protect the child who is transported in a metallic floating crib. The child brings out the best in Mando, who cares for him, whatever the cost.

There are some parallels here with the story of Moses, where a mother is desperately trying to save her child's life by placing him a basket of reeds and tar, floating him down the River Nile. We can only empathise with her heartache and that of mothers today facing similar challenges through persecution and war.

Today is called Mothering Sunday because we celebrate the gift of the Church as our Mother. She is not perfect, but no mothers are, but she faithfully teaches us, protects us, guides us, feeding us with the banquet of God's Word and with the Bread of Life at the Lord's Table.

We give thanks for our own mothers today. I challenge our children and young people to do something nice for your mums today; maybe by offer to wash up, setting the table or giving her a bunch of flowers to show her your appreciation and love.

In the gospel, as Jesus was dying on the cross, he looked after his mum by asking his friend John to take care of her, to act as her son and for Mary to be John's mother. In Christ, we are one family and therefore have many spiritual mothers, fathers, and children to care for.

We are never too old to need parenting. Sometimes in the vestry, I need someone to straighten my vestments out, so I don't lead a service looking like a sack of spuds. It is by means of our mutual love and concern, that the world will see that we are followers of Jesus. Amen.




