The Gospel John 12:20-33

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John.

Glory to you, O Lord.

Among those who went up to worship at the festival were some Greeks. They came to Philip, who was from Bethsaida in Galilee, and said to him, 'Sir, we wish to see Jesus.' Philip went and told Andrew; then Andrew and Philip went and told Jesus. Jesus answered them, 'The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified. Very truly, I tell you, unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, it remains just a single grain; but if it dies, it bears much fruit. Those who love their life lose it, and those who hate their life in this world will keep it for eternal life. Whoever serves me must follow me, and where I am, there will my servant be also. Whoever serves me, the Father will honour.

'Now my soul is troubled. And what should I say – "Father, save me from this hour"? No, it is for this reason that I have come to this hour. Father, glorify your name.' Then a voice came from heaven, 'I have glorified it, and I will glorify it again.' The crowd standing there heard it and said that it was thunder. Others said, 'An angel has spoken to him.' Jesus answered, 'This voice has come for your sake, not for mine. Now is the judgement of this world; now the ruler of this world will be driven out. And I, when I am lifted up from the earth, will draw all people to myself.' He said this to indicate the kind of death he was to die.

This is the Gospel of the Lord.

Praise to you, O Christ.

Reflection by Angela Gerrard (Licensed Lay Minister)

Mentioning the Greeks who wished to speak with Jesus at the beginning of our reading seems a bit of a red herring, because when Jesus speaks he is not just addressing them but his disciples and the whole crowd gathered for the festival.

As usual he tries to help them understand what is going to happen to him by likening himself to a grain of wheat. Unless it dies when it falls into the ground it will remain a single grain, but there in the ground it germinates and rises up to become a whole new plant with an 'ear' full of many seeds of grain to be harvested and provide food for both humans and animals. In the same way if Jesus does not die for humankind he will remain a single voice whose message will die with him in time. But by dying on the cross for us and being raised again by God, he and his message of salvation will live forever, from generation to generation.

Then Jesus questions rhetorically whether he should ask God to save him from death, but answers for himself, 'No' this is why he has come to earth, and he asks God to glorify his name. When God answers He has glorified it and will do again, there is confusion in the crowd – is it thunder they hear, or an angel speaking? Jesus tells then that God has spoken not for his sake but theirs – this is judgement coming; the ruler of the world, Satan, who was driven out of heaven by Michael and all the angels, will be overcome. Here is a force stronger than Satan, who has victory over death. When Jesus rises again and ascends into heaven all who believe in him and spread his message of salvation throughout the world and down the generations to 2021 and beyond, we will all, upon our own death transcend it and be drawn up to live again with Jesus for eternity in God's heavenly kingdom.

Now his followers can understand that when he is crucified and rises again in victory over death, they will begin to spread his gospel of salvation – the one has died for us all to rise and grow and bear fruit until everyone throughout the world can be glorified with him at the end of time in fulfilment of God's purpose.

May we praise his glorious name at the beginning of this Passiontide. AMEN

The Church of England has partnered with Marie Curie on 23 March 2021 to mark the first anniversary of the first lockdown in the UK with a national day of reflection to reflect on our collective loss due to Covid-19, to support those who have been bereaved, and to give hope for a brighter future.



The churches of the Pershore Benefice are being asked to participate in this day by marking the end of the one minute silent reflection at 12 noon by tolling a bell at 12:01.

ST ANDREW'S SURVEY - HAVE YOUR SAY AT PERSHORE LIBRARY


We have had a terrific response to the survey so far, but we are aware that there are people who are not able to access the links online to be able to have their say.

ECO NEWS - EARTH HOUR

Along with Worcester Cathedral and other churches throughout the country, Pershore Abbey will be marking Earth Hour on Saturday 27 March. Keep an eye on our Facebook page for more details.

Earth Hour was started by WWF and others in 2007 as a symbolic switching off of lights to call attention to climate change.



There are many things you could try this Earth Hour:-

- 1. Switch lights off in your home or where you have influence
- 2. Join the candle lit vigil from Worcester Cathedral on Facebook at 22:30 <u>www.facebook.com/WorcesterCathedral</u>
- 3. Watch the Earth Hour 'spotlight video' at <u>www.earthhour.org</u>
- 4. Play a non-electronic game such as cards, chess, Monopoly etc.
- 5. Let someone know you are taking part in Earth Hour, e.g. friend, councillor, MP
- 6. See if you can get you electric meter to stop by switching equipment off, in an act of solidarity with the people who have no electricity
