THE COLLECT

Almighty and everlasting God, who in your tender love towards the human race sent your Son our Saviour Jesus Christ to take upon him our flesh and to suffer death upon the cross: grant that we may follow the example of his patience and humility, and also be made partakers of his resurrection; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen.**

FIRST READING Isaiah 50: 4-9a

A reading from the Prophet Isaiah

The servant of the Lord said: The Lord God has given me the tongue of a teacher, that I may know how to sustain the weary with a word. Morning by morning he wakens — wakens my ear to listen as those who are taught. The Lord God has opened my ear, and I was not rebellious, I did not turn backwards. I gave my back to those who struck me, and my cheeks to those who pulled out the beard; I did not hide my face from insult and spitting.

The Lord God helps me; therefore I have not been disgraced; therefore I have set my face like flint, and I know that I shall not be put to shame; he who vindicates me is near. Who will contend with me? Let us stand up together. Who are my adversaries? Let them confront me. It is the Lord God who helps me; who will declare me guilty? All of them will wear out like a garment; the moth will eat them up.

SECOND READING

Philippians 2:5-11

A reading from the Letter to the Philippians

Let the same mind be in you that was in Christ Jesus, who, though he was in the form of God, did not regard equality with God as something to be exploited, but emptied himself, taking the form of a slave, being born in human likeness. And being found in human form, he humbled himself and became obedient to the point of death — even death on a cross. Therefore God also highly exalted him and gave him the name that is above every name, so that at the name of Jesus every knee should bend, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

THE GOSPEL Mark 11: 1-11

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Mark

When they were approaching Jerusalem, at Bethphage and Bethany, near the Mount of Olives, he sent two of his disciples and said to them, 'Go into the village ahead of you, and immediately as you enter it, you will find tied there a colt that has never been ridden; untie it and bring it. If anyone says to you, "Why are you doing this?" just say this, "The Lord needs it and will send it back here immediately." 'They went away and found a colt tied near a door, outside in the street. As they were untying it, some of the bystanders said to them, 'What are you doing, untying the colt?' They told them what Jesus had said; and they allowed them to take it. Then they brought the colt to Jesus and threw their cloaks on it; and he sat on it. Many people spread their cloaks on the road, and others spread leafy branches that they had cut in the fields. Then those who went ahead and those who followed were shouting, 'Hosanna! Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord! Blessed is the coming kingdom of our ancestor David! Hosanna in the highest heaven!' Then he entered Jerusalem and went into the temple; and when he had looked around at everything, as it was already late, he went out to Bethany with the twelve.

This is the Gospel of the Lord. **Praise to you, O Christ.**

REFLECTION BY REVD CLAIRE LORDING

People coming together for a common purpose heightens feelings and emotions and lets other know that an important message is being communicated. Black Lives Matters protests and rallies spoke of the need for racial justice across the world. Reclaim the Streets protests and vigils shared the vulnerability of women and the desire to walk their streets without fear. Kill the Bill protests want to share the human right to protest at all times.

As communities and countries we are defined by what we gather to shout about and what we protest about. They say, this is what we think is important and what we want

you to know. Communities can be reshaped by protests and gatherings, peaceful or otherwise. They can be strengthened and empowered by them, they can make a real difference.

Was any of this going through Jesus' mind as he arranged for a donkey to be ready for him to ride into Jerusalem? Did he know what the reaction of the people was going to be as they lined the streets? Did he anticipate that the religious leaders would want the crowds to be quiet and to stop making such a disturbance in their neighbourhood? Did he know this was going to be a gathering that would change the world?

On Palm Sunday we recall this greatest of entries into Jerusalem, where Jesus is proclaimed as the one who fulfils the promises of former times, and is acclaimed as a new king of a kingdom, God's kingdom, that values and loves ordinary people. We join our hosannas to the cries of those on the streets, welcoming their king. We cannot stand physically side by side this year as we remember this event, but in our hearts and minds we can go once more to Jerusalem. We can recall that this momentous event enables us to say that we are happy to be one of Jesus' supporters, encouragers followers, fellow protesters against those things that are contrary to God's kingdom. That we are shouting like mad for a king that we love and want to worship. For a king that changes us and those around us.

And then comes the challenge. Will we keep up our shouting, following and protesting as this Holy Week unfolds? Will we be empowered to keep on sharing the good news of Jesus Christ? The cross is starting to loom large and the mood is going to change. It's going to be hard to keep going, but maybe if we stick together our voices will still be heard and we will get through this week, to the new life protest of hope that next Sunday promises. Amen.

POST COMMUNION PRAYER

ST ANDREW'S SURVEY - HAVE YOUR SAY AT PERSHORE LIBRARY


We have had a terrific response to the survey so far, but we are aware that there are people who are not able to access the links online to be able to have their say.
