THE COLLECT

Almighty God, who through your only-begotten Son Jesus Christ have overcome death and opened to us the gate of everlasting life: grant that, as by your grace going before us you put into our minds good desires, so by your continual help we may bring them to good effect; through Jesus Christ our risen Lord. **Amen.**

FIRST READING Acts 8: 26-40

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

An angel of the Lord said to Philip, 'Get up and go towards the south to the road that goes down from Jerusalem to Gaza.' (This is a wilderness road.) So he got up and went. Now there was an Ethiopian eunuch, a court official of the Candace, queen of the Ethiopians, in charge of her entire treasury. He had come to Jerusalem to worship and was returning home; seated in his chariot, he was reading the prophet Isaiah. Then the Spirit said to Philip, 'Go over to this chariot and join it.' So Philip ran up to it and heard him reading the prophet Isaiah. He asked, 'Do you understand what you are reading?' He replied, 'How can I, unless someone guides me?' And he invited Philip to get in and sit beside him. Now the passage of the scripture that he was reading was this:

'Like a sheep he was led to the slaughter, and like a lamb silent before its shearer, so he does not open his mouth. In his humiliation justice was denied him. Who can describe his generation? For his life is taken away from the earth.'

The eunuch asked Philip, 'About whom, may I ask you, does the prophet say this, about himself or about someone else?' Then Philip began to speak, and starting with this scripture, he proclaimed to him the good news about Jesus. As they were going along the road, they came to some water; and the eunuch said, 'Look, here is water! What is to prevent me from being baptized?' He commanded the chariot to stop, and both of

them, Philip and the eunuch, went down into the water, and Philip baptized him. When they came up out of the water, the Spirit of the Lord snatched Philip away; the eunuch saw him no more, and went on his way rejoicing. But Philip found himself at Azotus, and as he was passing through the region, he proclaimed the good news to all the towns until he came to Caesarea.

SECOND READING 1 John 4:7-21

A reading from the First Letter of John

Beloved, let us love one another, because love is from God; everyone who loves is born of God and knows God. Whoever does not love does not know God, for God is love. God's love was revealed among us in this way: God sent his only Son into the world so that we might live through him. In this is love, not that we loved God but that he loved us and sent his Son to be the atoning sacrifice for our sins. Beloved, since God loved us so much, we also ought to love one another. No one has ever seen God; if we love one another, God lives in us, and his love is perfected in us.

By this we know that we abide in him and he in us, because he has given us of his Spirit. And we have seen and do testify that the Father has sent his Son as the Saviour of the world. God abides in those who confess that Jesus is the Son of God, and they abide in God. So we have known and believe the love that God has for us.

God is love, and those who abide in love abide in God, and God abides in them. Love has been perfected among us in this: that we may have boldness on the day of judgement, because as he is, so are we in this world. There is no fear in love, but perfect love casts out fear; for fear has to do with punishment, and whoever fears has not reached perfection in love. We love because he first loved us. Those who say, 'I love God,' and hate their brothers or sisters, are liars; for those who do not love a brother or sister whom they have seen, cannot love God whom they have not seen. The commandment we have from him is this: those who love God must love their brothers and sisters also.

THE GOSPEL John 15: 1-8

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John

Jesus said to his disciples: 'I am the true vine, and my Father is the vine-grower. He removes every branch in me that bears no fruit. Every branch that bears fruit he prunes to make it bear more fruit. You have already been cleansed by the word that I have spoken to you. Abide in me as I abide in you. Just as the branch cannot bear fruit by itself unless it abides in the vine, neither can you unless you abide in me. I am the vine, you are the branches. Those who abide in me and I in them bear much fruit, because apart from me you can do nothing. Whoever does not abide in me is thrown away like a

branch and withers; such branches are gathered, thrown into the fire, and burned. If you abide in me, and my words abide in you, ask for whatever you wish, and it will be done for you. My Father is glorified by this, that you bear much fruit and become my disciples.'

This is the Gospel of the Lord. **Praise to you, O Christ.**

REFLECTION BY REVD CLAIRE LORDING

It is beyond amazing that a NASA experiment has been able to turn some of the toxic atmosphere of Mars into oxygen. Not much, but enough for ten minutes worth of breathing. Something that is seemingly dead and without life can now become something that can sustain and enable life to survive. The good fruit of scientific enquiry needs to be celebrated. Something that is very thought provoking when we think about our sisters and brothers in India suffocating due the lack of oxygen in their hospitals. The very thing that enables life is now a precious commodity on the black market.

These powerful illustrations remind us that our lives are bound up with the lives of one another, regardless of our proximity to one another. What happens in any place asks questions of us and how we use our resources; how much we care for our neighbours; what our hopes, ambitions, dreams and vision are. Other people's stories and experiences become part of our story.

Jesus knew something of the complex and fascinating way in which people are bound together by relationships and a common humanity. Jesus calls himself the true vine, where we are the branches. An image that reveals how we are never on our own because we are fundamentally connected to other people and places. Where our energy and life comes from being connected to the vine, the life giving and sustaining power of Jesus. And it is from that source of life that we can grow and show the good fruit of the kingdom. Without this source of life, without this abiding in Jesus, we are counted as dead and worth nothing, cast aside.

It can be a frightening image, but it's intended to be one that encourages and inspires us. Can we give thanks today for something that has reminded us that we are connected to this beautiful human family, this wonderful family of the Kingdom of God? What fruit can we bear today that will best show our love of God in Jesus Christ and for our neighbour?

Prayer is at the very heart of what it means to be a branch, connected to the true vine. We may pray on our own, wondering what difference it's making, perhaps tempted to give up. But if we think about all the other people around the world praying with us and for us, we are overwhelmed by the love that sustains and upholds us. We may not personally be able to do anything practical for the people of India, but we can certainly pray, showing our love and solidarity, praying that the Spirit will lead those who can do something to do something. That is incredibly powerful, and that is good fruit.

In all that we say and think and do we have the opportunity to reveal that we can do nothing in our power, but only in the strength and power of God. We need the true vine more than we can ever imagine. We need each other. And once we know this we will find that God will keep on using and enabling us to grow into the very best version of ourselves, bearing the best possible fruit, for the benefit of all.

EVERYDAY FAITH IN WORK WORKSHOP - ONLINE MAY 19 / JUNE 10 2021, 19.30-21:00

How do your faith and your work connect with each other? A lot of what is said and written about faith in the workplace is about relationships: treating people well, finding opportunities to share appropriately what we believe, bearing witness through our character and behaviour to the difference God makes in our lives. But what about the nature of the work itself?

If we are employees, what are the aims and purposes of the companies we work for? Is the business about making money or making useful products, and where does the balance lie? How does my workplace serve the economy, or build up the common good? How does its structure promote just and equitable treatment of employee and customer alike? How much of a pay differential should there be between CEO and the lowest paid? Whether I am employed or self-employed, where do I, on a personal level, feel most fulfilled in my work and why? Do I see my work as a vocation to which God has called me? How does my faith help when things go wrong at work? These are more difficult questions, having no cut and dried answers, no obvious connections with what the bible has to say, nor any straightforward moral prescriptions.

This workshop is for people to come together to explore these and other questions, and how they might relate to their own work and workplace. The workshop is convened by Doug Chaplin, Discipleship and Lay Training Officer for the diocese and Dick Johnson, lead chaplain for Faith at Work in Worcestershire and lead chaplain to the Police and Fire Services. ST ANDREW'S SURVEY - HAVE YOUR SAY AT PERSHORE LIBRARY


We have had a terrific response to the survey so far, but we are aware that there are people who are not able to access the links online to be able to have their say.

PIPE DREAMS UPDATE

Work has continued at the Fratelli Ruffatti factory in Italy on the construction of the organ pipes, console and other internals for our new organ. Sadly national and international Covid-19 restrictions means that Ruffatti are now unable to deliver and install our new organ until 2022. Whilst this delay is very disappointing for us, we have been using the additional time to explore enhancements to the organ specification.

The stoplist for the original organ design provides the conditions for the highest possible versatility to support the liturgy, lead the choir and congregational singing and perform the classical organ repertoire of different styles including the performance of romantic organ music with special reference to the great works of the French composers.

Despite the very creative use of the available space within the original organ casings, it has not been possible to include stops that would satisfy the desired completeness of specification we identified with the Diocesan Organ Advisor in 2017. At that time of funding uncertainty, it was agreed that a suitably designed Festival Trumpet stop would fill the gap in specification although the additional pipes would have to be positioned in a separate location. Because of the funding uncertainties, it was decided to design the new organ console to make provision for such a stop at a time of greater funding certainty. We have now reached that time and, at our invitation, Ruffatti have prepared a proposal for the addition of a separate Festival Trumpet stop with the additional pipes located in the third triforium bay next to the main organ casings, as illustrated in the photomontage of the proposed new arrangement.

The proposal includes new access doors to the triforium from the new blower room to facilitate tuning. We have also taken the opportunity to add a Zimbelstern stop to within our specification the faculty application. This stop is to be made of 12 small brass bells on a rotating platform which when operated produces a very special effect that has been used in organs for centuries enhance musical to atmosphere. This stop may be used for Christmas carols, and a variety of baroque pieces and is small enough to be located within the main instrument casings.



These enhancements will add a new dimension to the instrument allowing performers a wider choice of repertoire. We are pleased to announce that the Friends of Pershore Abbey have generously agreed funding support for the additional work should our faculty application be successful.

ATTENDING A PUBLIC WORSHIP SERVICE

It is important that you only attend a public worship service if you feel that it is appropriate and safe for you to do so within the current National Lockdown guidelines.
