THE COLLECT

Lord of all life and power, who through the mighty resurrection of your Son overcame the old order of sin and death to make all things new in him: grant that we, being dead to sin and alive to you in Jesus Christ, may reign with him in glory; to whom with you and the Holy Spirit be praise and honour, glory and might, now and in all eternity. **Amen.**

FIRST READING

Acts 10: 34-43

A reading from the Book of Acts

Peter began to speak to those assembled in the house of Cornelius. 'I truly understand that God shows no partiality, but in every nation anyone who fears him and does what is right is acceptable to him. You know the message he sent to the people of Israel, preaching peace by Jesus Christ – he is Lord of all. That message spread throughout Judea, beginning in Galilee after the baptism that John announced: how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power; how he went about doing good and healing all who were oppressed by the devil, for God was with him. We are witnesses to all that he did both in Judea and in Jerusalem. They put him to death by hanging him on a tree; but God raised him on the third day and allowed him to appear, not to all the people but to us who were chosen by God as witnesses, and who ate and drank with him after he rose from the dead. He commanded us to preach to the people

and to testify that he is the one ordained by God as judge of the living and the dead. All the prophets testify about him that everyone who believes in him receives forgiveness of sins through his name.'

SECOND READING 1 Corinthians 15:1-11

A reading from the First Letter to the Corinthians

I would remind you, brothers and sisters, of the good news that I proclaimed to you, which you in turn received, in which also you stand, through which also you are being saved, if you hold firmly to the message that I proclaimed to you – unless you have come to believe in vain.

For I handed on to you as of first importance what I in turn had received: that Christ died for our sins in accordance with the scriptures, and that he was buried, and that he was raised on the third day in accordance with the scriptures, and that he appeared to Cephas, then to the twelve. Then he appeared to more than five hundred brothers and sisters at one time, most of whom are still alive, though some have died. Then he appeared to James, then to all the apostles. Last of all, as to one untimely born, he appeared also to me. For I am the least of the apostles, unfit to be called an apostle, because I persecuted the church of God. But by the grace of God I am what I am, and his grace towards me has not been in vain. On the contrary, I worked harder than any of them – though it was not I, but the grace of God that is with me. Whether then it was I or they, so we proclaim and so you have come to believe.

THE GOSPEL

John 20: 1-18

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John

Early on the first day of the week, while it was still dark, Mary Magdalene came to the tomb and saw that the stone had been removed from the tomb. So she ran and went to Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one whom Jesus loved, and said to them, 'They have taken the Lord out of the tomb, and we do not know where they have laid him.' Then Peter and the other disciple set out and went towards the tomb. The two were running together, but the other disciple outran Peter and reached the tomb first. He bent down to look in and saw the linen wrappings lying there, but he did not go in. Then Simon Peter came, following him, and went into the tomb. He saw the linen wrappings lying there, and the cloth that had been on Jesus' head, not lying with the linen wrappings but rolled up in a place by itself. Then the other disciple, who reached the tomb first, also went in, and he saw and believed; for as yet they did not understand the scripture, that he must rise from the dead. Then the disciples returned to their homes.

But Mary stood weeping outside the tomb. As she wept, she bent over to look into the tomb; and she saw two angels in white, sitting where the body of Jesus had been lying, one at the head and the other at the feet. They said to her, 'Woman, why are you weeping?' She said to them, 'They have taken away my Lord, and I do not know where they have laid him.' When she had said this, she turned around and saw Jesus standing there, but she did not know that it was Jesus. Jesus said to her, 'Woman, why are you weeping? For whom are you looking?' Supposing him to be the gardener, she said to him, 'Sir, if you have carried him away, tell me where you have laid him, and I will take him away.' Jesus said to her, 'Mary!' She turned and said to him in Hebrew, 'Rabbouni!' which means Teacher. Jesus said to her, 'Do not hold on to me, because I have not yet ascended to the Father. But go to my brothers and say to them, "I am ascending to my Father and your Father, to my God and your God."' Mary Magdalene went and announced to the disciples, 'I have seen the Lord'; and she told them that he had said these things to her.

This is the Gospel of the Lord. **Praise to you, O Christ.**

REFLECTION BY REVD CLAIRE LORDING

What are you going to do differently because of today? After another time of lockdown it may be that seeing family and friends is top of your priority list. Catching up in person, sharing time together and hearing all the news; it can only be a good thing. Will our lives be changed by being able to see other people, those we care about? It probably will, because that's the power of encounters with others.

Easter Day is a day full of difference, encounter and lives being changed. At the end of a harrowing week, with Jesus being laid in a tomb, where the darkness of the early morning resonates with the darkness of the tomb and the feelings of Jesus' friends and followers, an incredible encounter take place. Mary, in the midst of her grief and sadness, goes to the tomb so that she can pay her respects. An action that will be familiar to so many who have been bereaved, and most especially in the past year, when our remembering and respecting of those who have died has been interrupted by a situation beyond our control.

But this is the first Easter day and every thing is different. Mary's grief and devastation is magnified when she sees that the tomb is empty. How much worse can things get? Mary, overwhelmed by her love for Jesus, weeps, because there is nothing else for her to do. Her love for Jesus knows no end and the loss of his body is devastating.

Mary's Easter encounter with the risen Christ changes everything. As Jesus lovingly calls her by name, the strength of their relationship is revealed and their love for one another is clear. Not even death and a cold tomb has ended this life giving relationship. Now, in the power of the resurrection, their relationship changes into something new, that will bring hope and life to others. Go, Jesus says to Mary, go and tell others what you have seen and experienced. And that is exactly what Mary does. She becomes a witness and an evangelist for the good news of the gospel, that Jesus has risen; that love has overcome death and all that makes us less than human; that Jesus wants to share his love with every single one of us.

Mary is the first in a long line of people who have called out, "I have seen the Lord", and changed lives. What are we going to do differently because of today? How might we witness to the glorious news of the resurrection of Jesus from the dead, which reveals that hope and joy can transform the darkest places in our hearts and lives? Perhaps today, and in the days to come, we can be like Mary. Simply tell someone that you have seen the Lord and what a difference that has made to your life. This news is so good we mustn't keep it to ourselves. This Easter let's all do what we can to spread the love of God so that together we can transform the world. Alleluia! Amen.

Easter Message from the Bishop of Worcester, Dr John Inge

During the last year we've been confronted with death in a spectacular and shocking way. Thousands and thousands of people have died prematurely in the pandemic.

Death, the death of Jesus, is at the heart of the Christian Festival of Easter; but death does not have the last word. When God raised Jesus from the dead it was made clear for all to see that his love is stronger than death and stretches out into all eternity.

Easter can give hope in the face of the terrible death toll of this last year – and in the face of our own mortality – in a way that nothing else can. Yet many people find resurrection difficult to believe. As a former scientist, I don't. As my late wife, Denise, wrote shortly before she died:

The whole of human history is littered with things that were once deemed impossible. We know so much about matter and energy, but there is also much that we do not yet know and our knowledge is always changing. Five hundred years ago no one imagined light bulbs, or space travel, or genetic engineering. A decade or two ago saying we are made of star dust would have sounded like the stuff of a fairy tale, and now it sounds like particle physics. So I do not find it hard to imagine the possibility of a bodily resurrection.

No, neither do I, and it gives me hope for the future. Resurrection is not just about the future, though: it's about the here and now. It can bring meaning and purpose and hope. May it do that for you this Easter, as it has for millions over hundreds of years. Happy Easter!
