THE COLLECT

FIRST READING Acts 4: 32-35

A reading from the Book of Acts

The whole group of those who believed were of one heart and soul, and no one claimed private ownership of any possessions, but everything they owned was held in common. With great power the apostles gave their testimony to the resurrection of the Lord Jesus, and great grace was upon them all. There was not a needy person among them, for as many as owned lands or houses sold them and brought the proceeds of what was sold. They laid it at the apostles' feet, and it was distributed to each as any had need.

SECOND READING 1 John 1:1-2.2

A reading from the First Letter of John

We declare to you what was from the beginning, what we have heard, what we have seen with our eyes, what we have looked at and touched with our hands, concerning the word of life – this life was revealed, and we have seen it and testify to it, and declare to you the eternal life that was with the Father and was revealed to us – we declare to you what we have seen and heard so that you also may have fellowship with us; and truly our fellowship is with the Father and with his Son Jesus Christ. We are writing these things so that our joy may be complete.

This is the message we have heard from him and proclaim to you, that God is light and in him there is no darkness at all. If we say that we have fellowship with him while we are walking in darkness, we lie and do not do what is true; but if we walk in the light as he himself is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus his Son cleanses us from all sin. If we say that we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us. If we confess our sins, he who is faithful and just will forgive us our sins and cleanse us from all unrighteousness. If we say that we have not sinned, we make him a liar, and his word is not in us.

My little children, I am writing these things to you so that you may not sin. But if anyone does sin, we have an advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous; and he is the atoning sacrifice for our sins, and not for ours only but also for the sins of the whole world.

THE GOSPEL John 20: 19-31

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John

When it was evening on the first day of the week, and the doors of the house where the disciples had met were locked for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood among them and said, 'Peace be with you.' After he said this, he showed them his hands and his side. Then the disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, 'Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you.' When he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, 'Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained.'

But Thomas (who was called the Twin), one of the twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. So the other disciples told him, 'We have seen the Lord.' But he said to them, 'Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands, and put my finger in the mark of the nails and my hand in his side, I will not believe.'

A week later his disciples were again in the house, and Thomas was with them. Although the doors were shut, Jesus came and stood among them and said, 'Peace be with you.' Then he said to Thomas, 'Put your finger here and see my hands. Reach out your hand and put it in my side. Do not doubt but believe.' Thomas answered him, 'My Lord and my God!' Jesus said to him, 'Have you believed because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have come to believe.'

Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of his disciples, which are not written in this book. But these are written so that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that through believing you may have life in his name.

This is the Gospel of the Lord. **Praise to you, O Christ.**

REFLECTION BY ANGELA GERRARD (Licensed Lay Minister)

Have you a favourite apostle? Jesus had a favourite, often referred to in scripture as 'the disciple Jesus loved' – John. My favourite is Thomas – yes, the 'doubting' Thomas we hear about in today's Gospel reading. Thomas who was missing the first time Jesus appeared to the disciples in the locked upper room, he didn't believe in ghosts, so wanted proof of Jesus' resurrection. After all, there had been some initial confusion over Jesus' identity – Mary first thought he was the gardener; the disciples on the road to Emmaeus spent several hours with him yet only recognised him in the breaking of the bread.

Thomas wanted proof it really was Jesus as himself, bearing the wounds of his crucifixion, so the second time Jesus appeared he granted Thomas his wish. 'Put your hand in my side,' he said, but Thomas didn't need to, saying, 'My Lord and my God,' and that is the proof for us today — as Pope Gregory said, 'Thomas' disbelief did more for the cause of Christianity than the actions of any other disciple.'

Ten chapters earlier, when Jesus said, 'let us return to Jerusalem,' with all the dangers that awaited him there, it was Thomas who said, 'let us go also, so that we may die with him.' He was prepared to stand by Jesus and if necessary give up his life for him. So, Thomas, for me, is the champion who gives me the proof I need to believe in Jesus' resurrection and know he truly is the Son of God and one with the Father and the Holy Spirit.

Hopefully we are still being carried along on the crest of a wave of rejoicing and thankfulness after Easter Sunday, with a desire to share the good news of the risen Christ and all he has achieved for us. Today is the beginning of our witness – we are into the first week of the 40 days of Easter leading to the equally great and important celebration of Christ's Ascension to take his place as our advocate on the right hand of the Father.

When Christ appeared to the disciples, greeting them 'Peace be with you,' he breathed on them the Holy Spirit, saying, 'You are the witnesses of the fulfilment of the prophecies; by believing in me you have life in my name, and as the Father sent me, now I send you.' In the joy of Easter that overflows in our worship we too are commanded to spread the good news — we are enlightened, we walk in the light of Jesus, knowing we have been saved through him, for he remains the same with us today as when he appeared to those first disciples. Patient, loving and nurturing, encouraging and inspiring us as we struggle against the pleasures and pains of a world constantly tugging us in the opposite direction, he sends us out to spread the Easter message. People meet Jesus through us — we are the Easter people, so for us Easter can never be over. AMEN

ST ANDREW'S SURVEY - HAVE YOUR SAY AT PERSHORE LIBRARY


We have had a terrific response to the survey so far, but we are aware that there are people who are not able to access the links online to be able to have their say.

Easter Message from the Bishop of Worcester, Dr John Inge

During the last year we've been confronted with death in a spectacular and shocking way. Thousands and thousands of people have died prematurely in the pandemic.

Death, the death of Jesus, is at the heart of the Christian Festival of Easter; but death does not have the last word. When God raised Jesus from the dead it was made clear for all to see that his love is stronger than death and stretches out into all eternity.

Easter can give hope in the face of the terrible death toll of this last year – and in the face of our own mortality – in a way that nothing else can. Yet many people find resurrection difficult to believe. As a former scientist, I don't. As my late wife, Denise, wrote shortly before she died:

The whole of human history is littered with things that were once deemed impossible. We know so much about matter and energy, but there is also much that we do not yet know and our knowledge is always changing. Five hundred years ago no one imagined light bulbs, or space travel, or genetic engineering. A decade or two ago saying we are made of star dust would have sounded like the stuff of a fairy tale, and now it sounds like particle physics. So I do not find it hard to imagine the possibility of a bodily resurrection.

No, neither do I, and it gives me hope for the future. Resurrection is not just about the future, though: it's about the here and now. It can bring meaning and purpose and hope. May it do that for you this Easter, as it has for millions over hundreds of years.

Happy Easter!
