THE COLLECT

FIRST READING Acts 10: 44-48

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

While Peter was speaking, the Holy Spirit fell upon all who heard the word. The circumcised believers who had come with Peter were astounded that the gift of the Holy Spirit had been poured out even on the Gentiles, for they heard them speaking in tongues and extolling God. Then Peter said, 'Can anyone withhold the water for baptizing these people who have received the Holy Spirit just as we have?' So he ordered them to be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ. Then they invited him to stay for several days.

SECOND READING 1 John 5:1-6

A reading from the First Letter of John

Everyone who believes that Jesus is the Christ has been born of God, and everyone who loves the parent loves the child. By this we know that we love the children of God, when we love God and obey his commandments. For the love of God is this, that we obey his commandments. And his commandments are not burdensome, for whatever is born of God conquers the world. And this is the victory that conquers the world, our faith. Who is it that conquers the world but the one who believes that Jesus is the Son of God?

This is the one who came by water and blood, Jesus Christ, not with the water only but with the water and the blood. And the Spirit is the one that testifies, for the Spirit is the truth.

THE GOSPEL John 15: 9-17

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John

Jesus said to his disciples: 'As the Father has loved me, so I have loved you; abide in my love. If you keep my commandments, you will abide in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and abide in his love. I have said these things to you so that my joy may be in you, and that your joy may be complete.

'This is my commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you. No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends. You are my friends if you do what I command you. I do not call you servants any longer, because the servant does not know what the master is doing; but I have called you friends, because I have made known to you everything that I have heard from my Father. You did not choose me but I chose you. And I appointed you to go and bear fruit, fruit that will last, so that the Father will give you whatever you ask him in my name. I am giving you these commands so that you may love one another.'

This is the Gospel of the Lord. **Praise to you, O Christ.**

REFLECTION BY PETER STANSBIE (Abbey Reader)

On Wednesday Janet and I drove to Revills Farm shop in Defford (other farm shops are available). Janet hadn't been for a drive for over four weeks as she had been isolating before an operation two weeks ago. She commented how beautiful and green the countryside around us had become, the trees bursting into leaf and fields green with new planting and fresh grass. And I thought how lucky we are to live in such a place.

As it is Rogation Sunday today it seemed so appropriate. The word Rogation comes from Latin and means 'we ask'. Rogation is a time when we traditionally ask God to help us with our land. A time when we can thank him for what we have and all he gives us.

Rogation was also a time when people would 'Beat the bounds' of the Parish, and still in some places it is still done today. This was done originally because there were very few maps available and knowing the Parish boundary, your territory, was important.

As humans we seem keen to always keep boundaries: to have a clear sense of where we are, where 'our people' are and to protect and keep our own territory.

But that seems to me to be the exact opposite of the commandment Jesus gives his disciples, and us, in today's Gospel. It is a 'simple' command. Love one another as I have loved you. Simple perhaps to express but really challenging to even begin to follow.

Jesus's love was unbounded; it was God's love. A love that is complete and unconditional.

And in loving one another in this way there can be no boundaries, no restrictions, no them and us, just an all-embracing love for all.

That was a real challenge to the disciples then, and is to us now. To love each other as God loves us.

So in beating our bounds this year let us make it the whole world. Let us love one another as God loves us. Let us move towards a world of one people, one church, one body in Christ. That will truly bring us closer to everyone and to the Kingdom of God here and now.

ASCENSION DAY EUCHARIST SERVICE-PERSHORE ABBEY, 1900 THURSDAY 13 MAY: As

we enter the 11 days of Thy Kingdom Come 2021 on 13 May, we begin our journey with a special Eucharist at 1900 at Pershore Abbey on Ascension Day, marking the moment Jesus ascended into heaven before his disciples, at the village of Bethany, near Jerusalem. LIVING IN LOVE AND FAITH (LLF) COURSE - WEEK COMMENCING 7 JUNE 2021: This summer, we will be offering the whole benefice the opportunity to join the Church of England's "Living in Love and Faith" course which helps us to think more deeply about what it means to be human. It explores questions about identity, sexuality, relationships and marriage within the bigger picture of the good news of Jesus Christ. What does it mean to live in love and faith together as a Church? Each of the five sessions will take place via Zoom and will explore one key topic through video input, discussion, Bible study, reflection and prayer. Listening to each other will be really important. So that we can really engage with the weekly topics well we will be limiting each group to five participants and one leader. There will a group available each week day and we ask participants to stay with the same group for each session.

The groups will begin meeting on the following days and time, and will continue to meet for five weeks on the same days and times:

THY KINGDOM COME 13 - 23 MAY 2021:

Thy Kingdom Come is a global prayer movement that invites Christians around the world to pray from Ascension to Pentecost for more people to come to know Jesus.



During the 11 days of Thy Kingdom Come, it is hoped that everyone who takes part will:

- 1. Deepen their own relationship with Jesus Christ
- 2. Pray for 5 friends or family to come to faith in Jesus
- 3. Pray for the empowerment of the Spirit that we would be effective in our witness

After the very first Ascension Day the disciples gathered with Mary, constantly devoting themselves to prayer while they waited for the outpouring of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. Like them, our reliance on the gift of the Holy Spirit is total – on our own we can do nothing.

It is our prayer that those who have not yet heard the Good News of Jesus Christ and his love for the world will hear it for themselves, and respond and follow Him. Specifically, we again invite each and every Christian across the globe to pray that God's Spirit might work in the lives of 5 friends who have not responded with their 'Yes' to God's call.

What are we going to do in the Pershore Benefice for 'Thy Kingdom Come'?

Join us in church at **Pershore Abbey** on **13 May** for our **Ascension Day Service** at **1900.** The service will be recorded live and then shared on our social media pages.

This year in the Pershore Benefice we are also going to have an online Zoom **Novena** of prayer from the Friday after Ascension to Pentecost Eve on 22nd May. There will be daily prayer together at <u>1900</u> that will last between <u>10- 15 minutes</u> on each of these days. It's a great way to join in a great river of prayer of Christians not only here but all over the world and across many different denominations.

EVERYDAY FAITH IN WORK WORKSHOP - ONLINE MAY 19 / JUNE 10 2021, 19.30 – 21:00

How do your faith and your work connect with each other? A lot of what is said and written about faith in the workplace is about relationships: treating people well, finding opportunities to share appropriately what we believe, bearing witness through our character and behaviour to the difference God makes in our lives.



But what about the nature of the work itself?

If we are employees, what are the aims and purposes of the companies we work for? Is the business about making money or making useful products, and where does the balance lie? How does my workplace serve the economy, or build up the common good? How does its structure promote just and equitable treatment of employee and customer alike? How much of a pay differential should there be between CEO and the lowest paid? Whether I am employed or self-employed, where do I, on a personal level, feel most fulfilled in my work and why? Do I see my work as a vocation to which God has called me? How does my faith help when things go wrong at work? These are more difficult questions, having no cut and dried answers, no obvious connections with what the bible has to say, nor any straightforward moral prescriptions.

This workshop is for people to come together to explore these and other questions, and how they might relate to their own work and workplace. The workshop is convened by Doug Chaplin, Discipleship and Lay Training Officer for the diocese and Dick Johnson, lead chaplain for Faith at Work in Worcestershire and lead chaplain to the Police and Fire Services. ST ANDREW'S SURVEY - HAVE YOUR SAY AT PERSHORE LIBRARY


We have had a terrific response to the survey so far, but we are aware that there are people who are not able to access the links online to be able to have their say.
