## **FIRST READING** Acts 1: 15-17, 21-26

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

In those days Peter stood up among the believers (together the crowd numbered about one hundred and twenty people). He said, 'Friends, the scripture had to be fulfilled, which the Holy Spirit through David foretold concerning Judas, who became a guide for those who arrested Jesus – for he was numbered among us and was allotted his share in this ministry. So one of the men who have accompanied us throughout the time that the Lord Jesus went in and out among us, beginning from the baptism of John until the day when he was taken up from us – one of these must become a witness with us to his resurrection.' So they proposed two, Joseph called Barsabbas, who was also known as Justus, and Matthias. Then they prayed and said, 'Lord, you know everyone's heart. Show us which one of these two you have chosen to take the place in this ministry and apostleship from which Judas turned aside to go to his own place.' And they cast lots for them, and the lot fell on Matthias; and he was added to the eleven apostles.

#### SECOND READING 1 John 5:9-13

A reading from the First Letter of John

If we receive human testimony, the testimony of God is greater; for this is the testimony of God that he has testified to his Son. Those who believe in the Son of God have the

testimony in their hearts. Those who do not believe in God have made him a liar by not believing in the testimony that God has given concerning his Son. And this is the testimony: God gave us eternal life, and this life is in his Son. Whoever has the Son has life; whoever does not have the Son of God does not have life.

I write these things to you who believe in the name of the Son of God, so that you may know that you have eternal life.

For the word of the Lord. Thanks be to God.

THE GOSPEL John 17: 6-19

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John

Jesus looked up to heaven and prayed: 'Father, I have made your name known to those whom you gave me from the world. They were yours, and you gave them to me, and they have kept your word. Now they know that everything you have given me is from you; for the words that you gave to me I have given to them, and they have received them and know in truth that I came from you; and they have believed that you sent me. I am asking on their behalf; I am not asking on behalf of the world, but on behalf of those whom you gave me, because they are yours. All mine are yours, and yours are mine; and I have been glorified in them. And now I am no longer in the world, but they are in the world, and I am coming to you. Holy Father, protect them in your name that you have given me, so that they may be one, as we are one. While I was with them, I protected them in your name that you have given me. I guarded them, and not one of them was lost except the one destined to be lost, so that the scripture might be fulfilled. But now I am coming to you, and I speak these things in the world so that they may have my joy made complete in themselves. I have given them your word, and the world has hated them because they do not belong to the world, just as I do not belong to the world. I am not asking you to take them out of the world, but I ask you to protect them from the evil one. They do not belong to the world, just as I do not belong to the world. Sanctify them in the truth; your word is truth. As you have sent me into the world, so I have sent them into the world. And for their sakes I sanctify myself, so that they also may be sanctified in truth.'

This is the Gospel of the Lord. **Praise to you, O Christ.** 

## **REFLECTION BY ANGELA GERRARD (Licenced Lay Minister)**

Listening to or reading today's extract from John's Gospel we become witnesses to a very personal conversation between Jesus and his Father. Spoken as part of a final prayer before his betrayal and crucifixion but ultimately to his glory through resurrection, Jesus entreats God to protect his apostles as he sends them out into the world with his good news of salvation awaiting.

Yet his plea echoes through time to each of us today, to Christian believers globally and it is a call for unity. Throughout the Bible we can see how God delights when his people come together as one.

Today we face the biggest challenges — not only the global pandemic but the climate change emergency. There is extreme poverty in many countries of the world and those suffering right now must be supported to receive vaccination in pace with the western world and to adapt to their already changed climate, to avoid being pushed back even further. The only way we can confront these multiple challenges before us is through our united action. If Christians throughout the world unite as one voice we can have a more effective global presence and reach out to both halt the pandemic and reverse climate change.

This week has been Christian Aid Week, today is Christian Aid Sunday and hopefully many thousands of people, not necessarily churchgoers but those with a conscience for poverty of any kind or cause, will have made a donation to further their work globally. But more is needed - we need to add our voices by supporting CA campaigns in other ways such as signing online petitions, writing to our MP's, etc. Let no one be in any doubt that it is a global voice to prevent those already in poverty from being pushed back even further by unequal access to vaccinations or needing new ways of surviving climate change where they are, let alone providing them with clean water and sanitation. Equal access to better hygiene, medical care, employment and sustainable farming methods should be available worldwide, not just the western world and the wealthy.

Jesus may have been speaking to his Father about the first eleven followers he was sending into the world to deliver his good news, but those numbers have multiplied with every succeeding generation and he speaks for every one of us today. We are all in the world yet know we are dismissed as irrelevant at best or persecuted for our faith at worst, so our need for God's protection and sanctification is as important today as it ever was and is actually something we can be sure of. Surety in an uncertain world is precious and we need to both see and feel its reality to be emboldened to speak out against injustice in all its forms, especially the divide between rich and poor. Poverty in any form is not part of God's plan, so although individually we may not feel we can make a difference we are never alone in Christ and united we become one voice with the power to change a bleak prospect of the future into one that is filled with hope. Hope for both humankind and the world we inhabit – God's own wonder-filled creation. Amen

## MINISTRY AND CHURCH NEWS

LIVING IN LOVE AND FAITH (LLF) COURSE - WEEK COMMENCING 7 JUNE 2021: This summer, we will be offering the whole benefice the opportunity to join the Church of England's "Living in Love and Faith" course which helps us to think more deeply about what it means to be human. It explores questions about identity, sexuality, relationships and marriage within the bigger picture of the good news of Jesus Christ. What does it mean to live in love and faith together as a Church? Each of the five sessions will take place via Zoom and will explore one key topic through video input, discussion, Bible study, reflection and prayer. Listening to each other will be really important. So that we can really engage with the weekly topics well we will be limiting each group to five participants and one leader. There will a group available each week day and we ask participants to stay with the same group for each session.

If you'd like to join this course, and so that we can assign the right number of people to each group, can you please let me know by 2 June what your first and second group preferences are.



The groups will begin meeting on the following days and time, and will continue to meet for five weeks on the same days and times:

<u>DAILY PRAYER IN THE ABBEY APSE:</u> Do you have half an hour or may be an hour to spare in the morning and half an hour in the evening? The saying of Morning and Evening Prayer offers a wonderful opportunity to start each day in prayer, and to end our day with another time of prayer. There is something very special about remembering that God is with us the whole day through and bringing, in love, the hopes and concerns, the challenges and joys, of ourselves, our community and the world before God each day.

The saying of Morning and Evening Prayer is not just for the clergy but for everyone. We begin our day at 0800 with half an hour of silent prayer, which is followed by Morning Prayer, which usually lasts for about half an hour. We hope to be able to resume the Daily Eucharist very soon. We then come back together at 1700 for Evening Prayer. Everyone is warmly invited to join us for any or all of these times of prayer. FINAL CALL FOR FIRST WORKSHOP SESSION - EVERYDAY FAITH IN WORK WORKSHOP - ONLINE MAY 19 / JUNE 10 2021, 19.30— 21:00: How do your faith and your work connect with each other? A lot of what is said and written about faith in the workplace is about relationships: treating people well, finding opportunities to share appropriately what we believe, bearing witness through our character and behaviour to the difference God makes in our lives. But what about the nature of the work itself?

If we are employees, what are the aims and purposes of the companies we work for? Is the business about making money or making useful products, and where does the balance lie? How does my workplace serve the economy, or build up the common good? How does its structure promote just and equitable treatment of employee and customer alike? How much of a pay differential should there be between CEO and the lowest paid? Whether I am employed or self-employed, where do I, on a personal level, feel most fulfilled in my work and why? Do I see my work as a vocation to which God has called me? How does my faith help when things go wrong at work? These are more difficult questions, having no cut and dried answers, no obvious connections with what the bible has to say, nor any straightforward moral prescriptions.

This workshop is for people to come together to explore these and other questions, and

how they might relate to their own work and workplace. The workshop is convened by Doug Chaplin, Discipleship and Lay Training Officer for the diocese and Dick Johnson, lead chaplain for Faith at Work in Worcestershire and lead chaplain to the Police and Fire Services. ## **OTHER NEWS**



ST ANDREW'S GRANT WORK STARTS: You will see some work has started at St Andrew's and there will be more happening in the near future. It was awarded just over £59,000 from the Culture Heritage Fund to help it reopen after the Pandemic. Robin Hancox is leading the work to spend the money, which we have to do by the end of June. You might already have noticed the new water butts near the garage and the gravel in the area by the main door. Other work includes a new emergency exit door from the main hall, new gutters, some new carpeting, repointing of the stonework next to the garden and improvements to the internet (this has also been funded for the Abbey). The money will also help us build up our reserves following the loss of income over the last year. We are so pleased to receive this money and look forward to the re-opening of our Centre.
