FIRST READING Genesis 3: 8-15

A reading from the Book of Genesis

They heard the sound of the Lord God walking in the garden at the time of the evening breeze, and the man and his wife hid themselves from the presence of the Lord God among the trees of the garden. But the Lord God called to the man, and said to him, 'Where are you?' He said, 'I heard the sound of you in the garden, and I was afraid, because I was naked; and I hid myself.' He said, 'Who told you that you were naked? Have you eaten from the tree of which I commanded you not to eat?' The man said, 'The woman whom you gave to be with me, she gave me fruit from the tree, and I ate.' Then the Lord God said to the woman, 'What is this that you have done?' The woman said, 'The serpent tricked me, and I ate.' The Lord God said to the serpent, 'Because you have done this, cursed are you among all animals and among all wild creatures; upon your belly you shall go, and dust you shall eat all the days of your life. I will put enmity between you and the woman, and between your offspring and hers; he will strike your head, and you will strike his heel.'

SECOND READING 2 Corinthians 4:13-5:1

A reading from the Second Letter to the Corinthians

Just as we have the same spirit of faith that is in accordance with scripture — 'I believed, and so I spoke' — we also believe, and so we speak, because we know that the one who raised the Lord Jesus will raise us also with Jesus, and will bring us with you into his presence. Yes, everything is for your sake, so that grace, as it extends to more and more people, may increase thanksgiving, to the glory of God.

So we do not lose heart. Even though our outer nature is wasting away, our inner nature is being renewed day by day. For this slight momentary affliction is preparing us for an eternal weight of glory beyond all measure, because we look not at what can be seen but at what cannot be seen; for what can be seen is temporary, but what cannot be seen is eternal.

For we know that if the earthly tent we live in is destroyed, we have a building from God, a house not made with hands, eternal in the heavens.

THE GOSPEL Mark 3:20 –35

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Mark

The crowd came together again, so that Jesus and his companions could not even eat. When his family heard it, they went out to restrain him, for people were saying, 'He has gone out of his mind.' And the scribes who came down from Jerusalem said, 'He has Beelzebul, and by the ruler of the demons he casts out demons.' And he called them to him, and spoke to them in parables, 'How can Satan cast out Satan? If a kingdom is divided against itself, that kingdom cannot stand. And if a house is divided against itself, that house will not be able to stand. And if Satan has risen up against himself and is divided, he cannot stand, but his end has come. But no one can enter a strong man's house and plunder his property without first tying up the strong man; then indeed the house can be plundered.

Truly I tell you, people will be forgiven for their sins and whatever blasphemies they utter; but whoever blasphemes against the Holy Spirit can never have forgiveness, but is guilty of an eternal sin' – for they had said, 'He has an unclean spirit.'

Then his mother and his brothers came; and standing outside, they sent to him and called him. A crowd was sitting around him; and they said to him, 'Your mother and your brothers and sisters are outside, asking for you.' And he replied, 'Who are my mother and my brothers?' And looking at those who sat around him, he said, 'Here are my mother and my brothers! Whoever does the will of God is my brother and sister and mother.'

REFLECTION BY ANGELA GERRARD (Licensed Lay Minister)

Jesus challenged the scribes' thinking when they accused him of being a devil to cast out devils. Any kingdom or house cannot stand if it is divided against itself. It may seem obvious to us, but we have to remember the scribes, Pharisees and priests were feeling threatened by Jesus' new teachings — we can all resist change sometimes and we see the disastrous results of this across the world when regimes feel their authority is threatened.

Then later we heard how when Jesus' family were outside asking for him, he queried who were his family — anyone who did God's will was his sister, brother or mother. Harsh words? Or was he again challenging everyone to see the bigger picture? Humanity can only be stronger together, we have to strive for total unity if we are ever to achieve justice and peace throughout the world. In the 20th Century we saw two world wars and smaller wars are still raging now, many of them in the name of religions, whilst opposing their own teachings about the nature of God.

As we live through the Covid pandemic surely we can all see how necessary it is for all countries to have access to the vaccines, yet there are some countries who don't even have access to soap and clean water to fight the disease, let alone state of the art hospitals with sufficient ventilators to meet the need.

We host the G7 conference next week in Cornwall and the COP26 in Glasgow in November where the hope is that all countries can unite to cut global warming and pollution to save the planet God created for us to dwell in, wanting it to be a place in which we could thrive and grow, but we are in danger of suffocating it with what we saw as progress at the beginning of the Industrial Revolution but now can see was the beginning of all the damage we have done.

This coming week sees the start of our new Zoom house group 'Living in Love and Faith', which holds up the mirror to how we see diversity in our families of faith. Whether we are talking of race, colour, ethnicity, sexual or gender identity, if we are all made in the image of God and truly believe that, we have to accept diversity in our efforts to love each other and see everyone as our own brothers, sisters and mothers. Jesus epitomised love and compassion, he made a point of showing his love for the outcasts of society and the untouchables and it is his example we are called to follow. We have to be honest with ourselves about our preferences, remembering God knows all of our imperfections, yet he still loves us. Only our love for each other and our world will bring justice, peace, acceptance and equality, as God, through Jesus, promised to us in our next life with him in heaven.

<u>DAILY PRAYER IN THE ABBEY APSE:</u> Do you have half an hour or may be an hour to spare in the morning and half an hour in the evening? The saying of Morning and Evening Prayer offers a wonderful opportunity to start each day in prayer, and to end our day with another time of prayer. There is something very special about remembering that God is with us the whole day through and bringing, in love, the hopes and concerns, the challenges and joys, of ourselves, our community and the world before God each day.

The saying of Morning and Evening Prayer is not just for the clergy but for everyone. We begin our day at 0800 with half an hour of silent prayer, which is followed by Morning Prayer, which usually lasts for about half an hour. We hope to be able to resume the Daily Eucharist very soon. We then come back together at 1700 for Evening Prayer. Everyone is warmly invited to join us for any or all of these times of prayer. LIVE STREAMING IS COMING TO THE ABBEY!: The PCC is pleased to inform you that Archdeacon's permission has been granted for a permanent live streaming facility to be installed at the Abbey. This will enable us to share worship, services and other events as they happen across our social media platforms. We have become more aware during the past year of people who are not able to attend church in person, whether that's because of health, frailty or where they live. Live streaming is an important way in which we can connect with those people and with those perhaps exploring faith and church. We are hopeful that our live streaming will be up and running at some point in the summer. ST ANDREW'S GRANT WORK STARTS: You will see some work has started at St Andrew's and there will be more happening in the near future. It was awarded just over £59,000 from the Culture Heritage Fund to help it reopen after the Pandemic. Robin Hancox is leading the work to spend the money, which we have to do by the end of June. You might already have noticed the new water butts near the garage and the gravel in the area by the main door. Other work includes a new emergency exit door from the main hall, new gutters, some new carpeting, repointing of the stonework next to the garden and improvements to the internet (this has also been funded for the Abbey). The money will also help us build up our reserves following the loss of income over the last year. We are so pleased to receive this grant and look forward to re-opening our Centre.


Sir George Dowty was born in Pershore in 1901 at Rembrandt House (now Persora) in the High Street - the son of William Dowty, a chemist in Pershore, and his wife Laura.

An inventive aeronautical engineer and industrialist, he set up a successful business near Cheltenham. In WWII aircraft were fitted with Dowty undercarriage hydraulic units and later the company made hydraulic motorcycle forks, pit props and more.

Sir George died in 1975, his ashes buried in Pershore Cemetery with his twin brother Edward, who tragically died in a car accident in 1945.
