FIRST READING Ezekiel 17: 22-24

A reading from the Book of Ezekiel

Thus says the Lord God: I myself will take a sprig from the lofty top of a cedar; I will set it out. I will break off a tender one from the topmost of its young twigs; I myself will plant it on a high and lofty mountain. On the mountain height of Israel I will plant it, in order that it may produce boughs and bear fruit, and become a noble cedar. Under it every kind of bird will live; in the shade of its branches will nest winged creatures of every kind. All the trees of the field shall know that I am the Lord. I bring low the high tree, I make high the low tree; I dry up the green tree and make the dry tree flourish. I the Lord have spoken; I will accomplish it.

SECOND READING 2 Corinthians 5:6-10, 14-17

A reading from the Second Letter to the Corinthians

Brothers and sisters, we are always confident; even though we know that while we are at home in the body we are away from the Lord – for we walk by faith, not by sight. Yes, we do have confidence, and we would rather be away from the body and at home with the Lord. So whether we are at home or away, we make it our aim to please him. For all of us must appear before the judgement seat of Christ, so that each may receive recompense for what has been done in the body, whether good or evil.

The love of Christ urges us on, because we are convinced that one has died for all; therefore all have died. And he died for all, so that those who live might live no longer for themselves, but for him who died and was raised for them.

From now on, therefore, we regard no one from a human point of view; even though we once knew Christ from a human point of view, we know him no longer in that way. So if anyone is in Christ, there is a new creation: everything old has passed away; see, everything has become new!

THE GOSPEL Mark 4:26 - 34

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Mark

Such a large crowd gathered around Jesus that he got into a boat and began to teach them using many parables. Jesus said, 'The kingdom of God is as if someone would scatter seed on the ground, and would sleep and rise night and day, and the seed would sprout and grow, he does not know how. The earth produces of itself, first the stalk, then the head, then the full grain in the head. But when the grain is ripe, at once he goes in with his sickle, because the harvest has come.'

Jesus also said, 'With what can we compare the kingdom of God, or what parable will we use for it? It is like a mustard seed, which, when sown upon the ground, is the smallest of all the seeds on earth; yet when it is sown it grows up and becomes the greatest of all shrubs, and puts forth large branches, so that the birds of the air can make nests in its shade.' With many such parables he spoke the word to them, as they were able to hear it; he did not speak to them except in parables, but he explained everything in private to his disciples.

This is the Gospel of the Lord. **Praise to you, O Christ.**

REFLECTION BY REVD CLAIRE LORDING

Have you heard about courgette-gate yet? This summer, our wonderful volunteer gardeners at St Andrew's are once more attempting to grow vegetables, after last year's tomato crop was such a fabulous success. This year courgettes are the vegetable of choice and we can't wait to taste them. But we just need to make sure the slugs don't get there first! They seem to have done very well out of the first planting attempt, but we are hopeful about the second round of planting. Watch this space for courgette-gate updates!

The thing about gardening is that most of the good stuff happens when we're not looking. We plant and water things and hope for the best. Then, if all is well, plants grow and flourish and produce a harvest. Miracles are happening in gardens and in green spaces all the time.

Jesus shares his gardening knowledge with the assembled crowd, and it would have made good sense to them, as much as it makes sense to us. But Jesus wasn't focussed on gardening tips, preferring instead to get his hearers to think about the kingdom of God. The man, like us, plants his seeds and leaves them to get on with it. The man gets on with other things and the crop comes up all by itself and then the man gathers the harvest. William Countryman, reflecting on this parable, says that living a life of faith, hope and love is like that. We do our little bit, contribute what we can, "but the ultimate power is that of God, which gives the growth". It is a wonderfully reassuring parable that tells us that we don't have to be amazing for the kingdom to grow; we don't have to come up with ten fantastic ideas before breakfast; we don't have to try and make ourselves stand out and be the best. What we do need to do though is to get on with living the best version of our lives with God at its heart. And we'll do that often quietly and gently, often with no attention drawn to ourselves whatsoever, because it will be through the power of God's love that the kingdom will come and the kingdom will grow and flourish and bear fruit. It's the power of God's love that will make the difference for each and everyone of us.

As we continue to emerge from a challenging year it can be so easy to compare ourselves to others, and it doesn't matter whether we're talking about ourselves as individuals, or as a community or as a church. And when we do compare we often find ourselves being critical or less than satisfied as to where we are. We do that in the Church all the time. Today though, we are encouraged to remember that sometimes we just need to let God be God, let God get on with the growth and mission of the kingdom and the Church, let God work through us, in our times of activity as well as our times of stillness and being.

Today we can all be successful gardeners, confident in the knowledge that however small our contribution to the work of the kingdom and its harvest is, God will more than match it. So let us trust God, the best gardener of all, to enable not only God's Church to grow and flourish in ways beyond our imagining, but also to enable us to grow and flourish too. Amen.

Leading Worship in Church

Lay ministry in the Pershore and Evesham Deanery is thriving in many different ways. Authorised Lay Ministry (ALM) further enables and affirms this. ALM Worship Leaders are one form of authorised lay ministry.

Do you know someone in your parish or benefice who you think might be called to serve as an ALM Worship Leader?

Might it be you who God is asking to take this step?

With encouragement from the Diocese, the Pershore and Evesham Deanery is intending to offer the diocesan ALM Worship Leaders training course in our local area. We want to develop and encourage those who may be called to serve their communities and churches by this ministry.

The training consists of a one-year course. An outline of the modules and an introductory video to the diocesan 2020 course can be found here:

The intention of running the same course locally within our Deanery is to facilitate local support between those training, both through and beyond the duration of the course. It is also hoped that current ALM Worship Leaders will share in ongoing supportive relationships.

Once we know how many are interested, we will plan where the training will be provided, the dates, and for the core days in the programme whether it is preferable to team up with another deanery offering a similar course, to broaden the contexts of ministry.

Please consider if God is calling you to lead worship. Please think if you know someone in your benefice who might be called to serve in this way. Then, speak with Claire or Steve who will be pleased to help you discern a calling. They will also be able to support your next step. For the first course, please have this conversation **before 28**th **June 2021.**

Ordained ministry, licensed lay ministry, and authorised lay ministry all work together to support the shared witness and service of all who are called into Christ's fellowship.

OTHER NEWS

<u>LIVE STREAMING:</u> We are about to install equipment in the Abbey to allow us to show our services and other events live over the Internet. We hope this will help people who can't join us in person to be able to be part of our community with a real sense of being there with us.

The equipment is being installed during the week beginning 21 June and this will mean some disruption to the Abbey. The main issue is that the main, West doors will need to be closed for some of the time. This will mean using the side door to gain access to the building. There may be some other disruption but we know the installers will do their best to minimise this.

This is an exciting development so please be patient as the installation takes place.

ABBEY LIBRARY: The Abbey Library, which can be found next to the bookstall, is now open after an absence of fifteen months. There is a wonderful selection of books that people are very welcome to borrow. We just ask that you sanitise before browsing and sign out any books you want to take away. When you return them can you please put them in a plastic bag, preferably with a date on them, and leave them on the side. Happy reading!

ABBEY BOOKSTALL REOPENING!: We are really pleased to announce that the bookstall is now open for business! All we ask is that customers sanitise before browsing. When unattended, payments can be made through the slot on the desk or via the contactless device by the noticeboards.



ST ANDREW'S GRANT WORK STARTS: You will see some work has started at St Andrew's and there will be more happening in the near future. It was awarded just over £59,000 from the Culture Heritage Fund to help it reopen after the Pandemic. Robin Hancox is leading the work to spend the money, which we have to do by the end of June. You might already have noticed the new water butts near the garage and the gravel in the area by the main door. Other work includes a new emergency exit door from the main hall, new gutters, some new carpeting, repointing of the stonework next to the garden and improvements to the internet (this has also been funded for the Abbey). The money will also help us build up our reserves following the loss of income over the last year.

We are so pleased to receive this grant and look forward to re-opening our Centre.


