THE COLLECT

FIRST READING Job 38: 1-11

A reading from the Book of Job

The Lord answered Job out of the whirlwind: 'Who is this that darkens counsel by words without knowledge? Gird up your loins like a man, I will question you, and you shall declare to me. 'Where were you when I laid the foundation of the earth? Tell me, if you have understanding. Who determined its measurements — surely you know! Or who stretched the line upon it? On what were its bases sunk, or who laid its cornerstone when the morning stars sang together and all the heavenly beings shouted for joy? 'Or who shut in the sea with doors when it burst out from the womb? — when I made the clouds its garment, and thick darkness its swaddling band, and prescribed bounds for it, and set bars and doors, and said, "Thus far shall you come, and no farther, and here shall your proud waves be stopped"?

SECOND READING 2 Corinthians 6:1-13

A reading from the Second Letter to the Corinthians

As we work together with Christ, we urge you also not to accept the grace of God in vain. For he says, 'At an acceptable time I have listened to you, and on a day of salvation I have helped you.' See, now is the acceptable time; see, now is the day of salvation! We are putting no obstacle in anyone's way, so that no fault may be found with our ministry,

but as servants of God we have commended ourselves in every way: through great endurance, in afflictions, hardships, calamities, beatings, imprisonments, riots, labours, sleepless nights, hunger; by purity, knowledge, patience, kindness, holiness of spirit, genuine love, truthful speech, and the power of God; with the weapons of righteousness for the right hand and for the left; in honour and dishonour, in ill repute and good repute. We are treated as impostors, and yet are true; as unknown, and yet are well known; as dying, and see – we are alive; as punished, and yet not killed; as sorrowful, yet always rejoicing; as poor, yet making many rich; as having nothing, and yet possessing everything. We have spoken frankly to you Corinthians; our heart is wide open to you. There is no restriction in our affections, but only in yours. In return – I speak as to children – open wide your hearts also.

THE GOSPEL Mark 4: 35 - 41

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Mark

When evening had come, Jesus said to his disciples, 'Let us go across to the other side.' And leaving the crowd behind, they took him with them in the boat, just as he was. Other boats were with him. A great gale arose, and the waves beat into the boat, so that the boat was already being swamped. But he was in the stern, asleep on the cushion; and they woke him up and said to him, 'Teacher, do you not care that we are perishing?' He woke up and rebuked the wind, and said to the sea, 'Peace! Be still!' Then the wind ceased, and there was a dead calm. He said to them, 'Why are you afraid? Have you still no faith?' And they were filled with great awe and said to one another, 'Who then is this, that even the wind and the sea obey him?'

REFLECTION BY PETER STANSBIE (Abbey Reader)

Storms can blow up without warning. Especially, it seems, on the water.

I can remember being on a cruise on board Queen Elizabeth (other ships are available). We had a clear sunny morning and were heading for port in Gibraltar. Heading around the Rock it did seem to suddenly turn windier, but it wasn't until we entered the outer harbour that the storm really struck. The pilot boat trying to guide us could just be seen being tossed between huge waves and the wind seemed to be moving our huge ship sideways.

The Captain came on the tannoy and announced that we could not dock as we could be blown against our moorings. He could not risk us, or the ship. OK, we did not have to don the lifejackets but I think most of us were very pleased when we returned to much calmer waters. Not all, however, as some were furious they could not buy their duty free cigarettes, alcohol and jewellery. Some people are never satisfied.

The Gospel today tells the story of a storm on the Sea of Galilee. And how Jesus calmed it. Perhaps one of the best-known stories in the bible.

Jesus was in the boat, exhausted after a really busy few days. And he slept on like a baby so often does through a storm, when all around are wide awake and frightened for their lives. But all his friends had to do was wake him and he calmed the elements.

And like the weather, life is not always calm – far from it. One moment all is well and the next its chaos. Remember Christmas 2020 - all was going along fine then wham, Covid hit and life changed for the whole world. It was so hard for so many of us to understand, and really frightening. And so many of us will have had horrible, frightening storms hit our own individual lives when we least expect it.

That's usually when we want the help of God. That's when we do that strange thing called "pray"

And sometimes it feels like God is asleep. Like the baby fast asleep when all around is chaos and noise. But call their name and they are immediately awake. I like to think God is like that. He does not cause the difficulties. He is not part of the problem he is there to help. To calm the storm.

Prayer is our way of waking him. Of saying we are afraid, we need help, of listening for what is offered. What a reassurance that can be in a trying and troubled life or world.

God may not instantly calm the storm as Jesus did, but he can offer solace and find us an inner peace, which we so often need. So don't be afraid to wake God with a prayer, he is there for you and for me; perhaps not to instantly stop the storm but always to help us find peace and love in midst of it, because he is there for us always.

Leading Worship in Church

Lay ministry in the Pershore and Evesham Deanery is thriving in many different ways. Authorised Lay Ministry (ALM) further enables and affirms this. ALM Worship Leaders are one form of authorised lay ministry.

Do you know someone in your parish or benefice who you think might be called to serve as an ALM Worship Leader?

Might it be you who God is asking to take this step?

With encouragement from the Diocese, the Pershore and Evesham Deanery is intending to offer the diocesan ALM Worship Leaders training course in our local area. We want to develop and encourage those who may be called to serve their communities and churches by this ministry.

The training consists of a one-year course. An outline of the modules and an introductory video to the diocesan 2020 course can be found here:

The intention of running the same course locally within our Deanery is to facilitate local support between those training, both through and beyond the duration of the course. It is also hoped that current ALM Worship Leaders will share in ongoing supportive relationships.

Once we know how many are interested, we will plan where the training will be provided, the dates, and for the core days in the programme whether it is preferable to team up with another deanery offering a similar course, to broaden the contexts of ministry.

Please consider if God is calling you to lead worship. Please think if you know someone in your benefice who might be called to serve in this way. Then, speak with Claire or Steve who will be pleased to help you discern a calling. They will also be able to support your next step. For the first course, please have this conversation **before 28**th **June 2021.**

Ordained ministry, licensed lay ministry, and authorised lay ministry all work together to support the shared witness and service of all who are called into Christ's fellowship.

OTHER NEWS

<u>LIVE STREAMING:</u> We are about to install equipment in the Abbey to allow us to show our services and other events live over the Internet. We hope this will help people who can't join us in person to be able to be part of our community with a real sense of being there with us.

The equipment is being installed during the week beginning 21 June and this will mean some disruption to the Abbey. The main issue is that the main, West doors will need to be closed for some of the time. This will mean using the side door to gain access to the building. There may be some other disruption but we know the installers will do their best to minimise this.

This is an exciting development so please be patient as the installation takes place.

ABBEY LIBRARY: The Abbey Library, which can be found next to the bookstall, is now open after an absence of fifteen months. There is a wonderful selection of books that people are very welcome to borrow. We just ask that you sanitise before browsing and sign out any books you want to take away. When you return them can you please put them in a plastic bag, preferably with a date on them, and leave them on the side. Happy reading!



<u>ABBEY BOOKSTALL REOPENING!</u>: We are really pleased to announce that the bookstall is now open for business! All we ask is that customers sanitise before browsing. When unattended, payments can be made through the slot on the desk or via the contactless device by the noticeboards.

ST ANDREW'S GRANT WORK STARTS: You will see some work has started at St Andrew's and there will be more happening in the near future. It was awarded just over £59,000 from the Culture Heritage Fund to help it reopen after the Pandemic. Robin Hancox is leading the work to spend the money, which we have to do by the end of June. You might already have noticed the new water butts near the garage and the gravel in the area by the main door. Other work includes a new emergency exit door from the main hall, new gutters, some new carpeting, repointing of the stonework next to the garden and improvements to the internet (this has also been funded for the Abbey). The money will also help us build up our reserves following the loss of income over the last year. We are so pleased to receive this grant and look forward to re-opening our Centre.


AND FINALLY . . .


