FIRST READING

Wisdom 1:13-15; 2:23,24

A reading from the Wisdom of Solomon

Because God did not make death, and he does not delight in the death of the living. For he created all things so that they might exist; the generative forces of the world are wholesome, and there is no destructive poison in them, and the dominion of Hades is not on earth. For righteousness is immortal. For God created us for incorruption, and made us in the image of his own eternity, but through the devil's envy death entered the world, and those who belong to his company experience it.

SECOND READING 2 Corinthians 8:7-15

A reading from the Second Letter to the Corinthians

You excel in everything – in faith, in speech, in knowledge, in utmost eagerness, and in our love for you – so we want you to excel also in this generous undertaking.

I do not say this as a command, but I am testing the genuineness of your love against the earnestness of others. For you know the generous act of our Lord Jesus Christ, that though he was rich, yet for your sakes he became poor, so that by his poverty you might become rich. And in this matter I am giving my advice: it is appropriate for you who began last year not only to do something but even to desire to do something – now

finish doing it, so that your eagerness may be matched by completing it according to your means. For if the eagerness is there, the gift is acceptable according to what one has – not according to what one does not have. I do not mean that there should be relief for others and pressure on you, but it is a question of a fair balance between your present abundance and their need, so that their abundance may be for your need, in order that there may be a fair balance. As it is written,

'The one who had much did not have too much, and the one who had little did not have too little.'

THE GOSPEL Mark 5: 21 - end

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Mark.

Glory to you, O Lord.

When Jesus had crossed again in the boat to the other side, a great crowd gathered around him; and he was by the lake. Then one of the leaders of the synagogue named Jairus came and, when he saw him, fell at his feet and begged him repeatedly, 'My little daughter is at the point of death. Come and lay your hands on her, so that she may be made well, and live.' So he went with him.

And a large crowd followed him and pressed in on him. Now there was a woman who had been suffering from haemorrhages for twelve years. She had endured much under many physicians, and had spent all that she had; and she was no better, but rather grew worse. She had heard about Jesus, and came up behind him in the crowd and touched his cloak, for she said, 'If I but touch his clothes, I will be made well.' Immediately her haemorrhage stopped; and she felt in her body that she was healed of her disease. Immediately aware that power had gone forth from him, Jesus turned about in the crowd and said, 'Who touched my clothes?' And his disciples said to him, 'You see the crowd pressing in on you; how can you say, "Who touched me?"' He looked all around to see who had done it. But the woman, knowing what had happened to her, came in fear and trembling, fell down before him, and told him the whole truth. He said to her, 'Daughter, your faith has made you well; go in peace, and be healed of your disease.'

While he was still speaking, some people came from the leader's house to say, 'Your daughter is dead. Why trouble the teacher any further?' But overhearing what they said, Jesus said to the leader of the synagogue, 'Do not fear, only believe.' He allowed no one to follow him except Peter, James, and John, the brother of James. When they came to the house of the leader of the synagogue, he saw a commotion, people weeping and wailing loudly. When he had entered, he said to them, 'Why do you make a commotion and weep? The child is not dead but sleeping.' And they laughed at him. Then he put them all outside, and took the child's father and mother and those who were with him, and went in where the child was. He took her by the hand and said to her, 'Talitha cum,'

which means, 'Little girl, get up!' And immediately the girl got up and began to walk about (she was twelve years of age). At this they were overcome with amazement. He strictly ordered them that no one should know this, and told them to give her something to eat.

This is the Gospel of the Lord. **Praise to you, O Christ.**

REFLECTION BY REVD STEVE DUNTON

Last Saturday I met up with an old work colleague who I hadn't seen for a while. On greeting me, she asked if we could have a hug. It felt wonderful to be able to do something that we have been either forbidden or strongly discouraged to do for nearly 16 months.

In today's gospel, Jesus accedes to the request of Jairus, the ruler of the synagogue to visit his terminally sick daughter. Upon the way, he encounters the woman with the haemorrhage who had been ill for twelve years and had used up all of her resources on futile treatments. Her condition would have rendered her ritually impure and marginalised in her society, experiencing social distancing as a lived reality. The woman would have been utterly starved of touch, living on the outer fringes of her community. She crept up on Jesus from behind in order to unobtrusively touch his cloak, but Jesus did notice her touch and above all her immense faith.

In the fast-paced action that is Mark's gospel, Jesus continues to Jairus' house. He is openly derided and ridiculed by scoffers upon arrival. He reaches out and takes her by the hand and her life is restored. In both healings, the Lord, speaks and acts tenderly to both women. He refers to the woman with the haemorrhage as his 'daughter' and to the girl as "Little lamb or kid," showing that in the new order, we are all part of Jesus' family and should treat each other as family. In both of these accounts, both faith and touch are at the heart of the miracle.

This should not surprise us as Christianity is an incarnational faith, presenting a physical and embodied religion employing sacramental signs to reveal God's grace and presence to us; oil, water, bread, wine as well as the laying on of hands. This is why the pandemic has been hard for us as Christians, particularly when we could not gather for worship or celebrate the sacraments. A yearning for the sacramental reveals a deep need within us to receive, through physical signs, the touch of Christ, bestowing upon us God's love and offering each of us healing and a new life.

Like the woman, none of us ever go unnoticed by the Lord. Jesus longs to away our shame, leading us by the hand, so that we can stand in his presence as a precious members of his family, born from his torn and broken side upon the cross. He then wants us all to help find new members of his family, to bring them to his gentle, saving touch, drawing them in from the margins and restoring them to the fulness of life.

Notice how immediately after Jesus had awoken the girl from her 'sleep,' he tells her parents to get her something to eat. Jesus continues to care for our deepest needs by giving himself to us as food in bread and wine, food that fills our hearts and will sustain us for eternity. Amen.

POST COMMUNION PRAYER

Eternal God, comfort of the afflicted and healer of the broken, you have fed us at the table of life and hope: teach us the ways of gentleness and peace, that all the world may acknowledge the kingdom of your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen**

Leading Worship in Church

Lay ministry in the Pershore and Evesham Deanery is thriving in many different ways. Authorised Lay Ministry (ALM) further enables and affirms this. ALM Worship Leaders are one form of authorised lay ministry.

Do you know someone in your parish or benefice who you think might be called to serve as an ALM Worship Leader?

Might it be you who God is asking to take this step?

With encouragement from the Diocese, the Pershore and Evesham Deanery is intending to offer the diocesan ALM Worship Leaders training course in our local area. We want to develop and encourage those who may be called to serve their communities and churches by this ministry.

The training consists of a one-year course. An outline of the modules and an introductory video to the diocesan 2020 course can be found here:

The intention of running the same course locally within our Deanery is to facilitate local support between those training, both through and beyond the duration of the course. It is also hoped that current ALM Worship Leaders will share in ongoing supportive relationships.

Once we know how many are interested, we will plan where the training will be provided, the dates, and for the core days in the programme whether it is preferable to team up with another deanery offering a similar course, to broaden the contexts of ministry.

Please consider if God is calling you to lead worship. Please think if you know someone in your benefice who might be called to serve in this way. Then, speak with Claire or Steve who will be pleased to help you discern a calling. They will also be able to support your next step. For the first course, please have this conversation **before 28**th **June 2021.**

Ordained ministry, licensed lay ministry, and authorised lay ministry all work together to support the shared witness and service of all who are called into Christ's fellowship.

LIVE STREAMING: We are currently installing equipment in the Abbey to allow us to show our services and other events live over the Internet. We hope this will help people who can't join us in person to be able to be part of our community with a real sense of being there with us. This is an exciting development so please be patient as we complete the installation.

ABBEY LIBRARY: The Abbey Library, which can be found next to the bookstall, is now open after an absence of fifteen months. There is a wonderful selection of books that people are very welcome to borrow. We just ask that you sanitise before browsing and sign out any books you want to take away. When you return them can you please put them in a plastic bag, preferably with a date on them, and leave them on the side. Happy reading!

ABBEY BOOKSTALL REOPENING!: We are really pleased to announce that the bookstall is now open for business! All we ask is that customers sanitise before browsing. When unattended, payments can be made through the slot on the desk or via the contactless device by the noticeboards.

ST ANDREW'S GRANT WORK STARTS: You will see some work has started at St Andrew's and there will be more happening in the near future. It was awarded just over £59,000 from the Culture Heritage Fund to help it reopen after the Pandemic. Robin Hancox is leading the work to spend the money, which we have to do by the end of June. You might already have noticed the new water butts near the garage and the gravel in the area by the main door. Other work includes a new emergency exit door from the main hall, new gutters, some new carpeting, repointing of the stonework next to the garden and improvements to the internet (this has also been funded for the Abbey). The money will also help us build up our reserves following the loss of income over the last year. We are so pleased to receive this grant and look forward to re-opening our Centre.
