THE COLLECT

Almighty and everlasting God, you have given us your servants grace, by the confession of a true faith, to acknowledge the glory of the eternal Trinity and in the power of the divine majesty to worship the Unity: keep us steadfast in this faith, that we may evermore be defended from all adversities; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen**

FIRST READING

Isaiah 6: 1-8

A reading from the Prophet Isaiah

In the year that King Uzziah died, I saw the Lord sitting on a throne, high and lofty; and the hem of his robe filled the temple. Seraphs were in attendance above him; each had six wings: with two they covered their faces, and with two they covered their feet, and with two they flew. And one called to another and said: 'Holy, holy, holy is the Lord of hosts; the whole earth is full of his glory.' The pivots on the thresholds shook at the voices of those who called, and the house filled with smoke. And I said: 'Woe is me! I am lost, for I am a man of unclean lips, and I live among a people of unclean lips; yet my eyes have seen the King, the Lord of hosts!' Then one of the seraphs flew to me, holding a live coal that had been taken from the altar with a pair of tongs. The seraph touched my mouth with it and said: 'Now that this has touched your lips, your guilt has departed and your sin is blotted out.' Then I heard the voice of the Lord saying, 'Whom shall I send, and who will go for us?' And I said, 'Here am I; send me!'

SECOND READING Romans 8:12-17

A reading from the Letter to the Romans

Brothers and sisters, we are debtors, not to the flesh, to live according to the flesh - for if you live according to the flesh, you will die; but if by the Spirit you put to death the deeds of the body, you will live. For all who are led by the Spirit of God are children of God. For you did not receive a spirit of slavery to fall back into fear, but you have received a spirit of adoption. When we cry, 'Abba! Father!' it is that very Spirit bearing witness with our spirit that we are children of God, and if children, then heirs, heirs of God and joint heirs with Christ – if, in fact, we suffer with him so that we may also be glorified with him.

THE GOSPEL John 3:1 -17

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John

There was a Pharisee named Nicodemus, a leader of the Jews. He came to Jesus by night and said to him, 'Rabbi, we know that you are a teacher who has come from God; for no one can do these signs that you do apart from the presence of God.' Jesus answered him, 'Very truly, I tell you, no one can see the kingdom of God without being born from above.' Nicodemus said to him, 'How can anyone be born after having grown old? Can one enter a second time into the mother's womb and be born?' Jesus answered, 'Very truly, I tell you, no one can enter the kingdom of God without being born of water and Spirit. What is born of the flesh is flesh, and what is born of the Spirit is spirit. Do not be astonished that I said to you, "You must be born from above." The wind blows where it chooses, and you hear the sound of it, but you do not know where it comes from or where it goes. So it is with everyone who is born of the Spirit.' Nicodemus said to him, 'How can these things be?' Jesus answered him, 'Are you a teacher of Israel, and yet you do not understand these things?

'Very truly, I tell you, we speak of what we know and testify to what we have seen; yet you do not receive our testimony. If I have told you about earthly things and you do not believe, how can you believe if I tell you about heavenly things? No one has ascended into heaven except the one who descended from heaven, the Son of Man. And just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, that whoever believes in him may have eternal life. For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life. Indeed, God did not send the Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him.'

This is the Gospel of the Lord. **Praise to you, O Christ.**

REFLECTION BY REVD CLAIRE LORDING

Have you ever read a book or watched a drama on television where everything hinges on the 'big reveal' at the end? You know the one where we suddenly realise who is related to who and all the things we didn't understand about the plot and story are revealed. Suddenly it all makes sense!

Trinity Sunday can feel a bit like that as we come together to celebrate the awesome nature of God who is Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

We give thanks today and pray for a creator God who, out of deep love, created and fashioned the world. We look around us and although there is much that will always sadden us, there is so much to be in awe of. So much beauty and wonder that this creation surely cannot be chance or a fortunate accident.

Our creator God takes the story onto another level when, out of love, God the Father sends his Son to share in this life that God has created. Jesus enters fully into the joy and pain of what it is to be human, and because he and God have been one since before time, it is God who is truly with us sharing a human life. In love Jesus smiles and laughs, travels and eats with others, makes friends and enemies and dies on a cross. And from that darkest of places, it is in love that God raises his precious Son from the dead and life and hope is restored.

Our story doesn't end there. Through the power of the Holy Spirit, lovingly sent to be with us, we know that we can have a profound union with God which is real. The Holy Spirit not only completes the Trinity, she prompts and encourages us to share the powerful love of the Holy Trinity ever present with us.

Exploring what it is to be human in the midst of the complexity and love of the Trinity is a task we are all called to take seriously. The 'big reveal' for us is to know what God is calling us to be and how we might live our lives reflecting God's glory and love. To help us in that task we are invited to join a new course, Living in Love and Faith, produced by the Church, which aims to help us think more deeply about what it means to be human, by exploring Christian teaching and learning about identity, sexuality, relationships and marriage. This is not a course where we will be told what to think or believe, rather it is an opportunity to explore together what we feel and think about these important topics, for ourselves and for our church. It also is an incredible space to listen to one another, to those who think like us and those who think differently. Our Archbishops commend this course to us saying, "Our hope and prayer is that as we engage with it together across the church, we will learn to live more fully in the way of Christ - in love and faith."

This is important work for a people called to live in the belief that the Trinity matters.

Together, may we all journey more deeply into the very heart of God, so that we may be more fully human and alive to God. And may this prayer by Richard Rohr sustain us on our way:

God for us, we call you Father.

God alongside us, we call you Jesus.

God within us, we call you Holy Spirit.

You are the eternal mystery that enables, enfolds and enlivens all things,

Even us, even me. Amen.

MINISTRY AND CHURCH NEWS

LIVING IN LOVE AND FAITH (LLF) COURSE - WEEK COMMENCING 7 JUNE 2021: This summer, we will be offering the whole benefice the opportunity to join the Church of England's "Living in Love and Faith" course which helps us to think more deeply about what it means to be human. It explores questions about identity, sexuality, relationships and marriage within the bigger picture of the good news of Jesus Christ. What does it mean to live in love and faith together as a Church? Each of the five sessions will take place via Zoom and will explore one key topic through video input, discussion, Bible study, reflection and prayer. Listening to each other will be really important. So that we can really engage with the weekly topics well we will be limiting each group to five participants and one leader. There will a group available each week day and we ask participants to stay with the same group for each session.

If you'd like to join this course, and so that we can assign the right number of people to each group, can you please let me know by 2 June what your first and second group preferences are.



The groups will begin meeting on the following days and time, and will continue to meet for five weeks on the same days and times:

<u>DAILY PRAYER IN THE ABBEY APSE:</u> Do you have half an hour or may be an hour to spare in the morning and half an hour in the evening? The saying of Morning and Evening Prayer offers a wonderful opportunity to start each day in prayer, and to end our day with another time of prayer. There is something very special about remembering that God is with us the whole day through and bringing, in love, the hopes and concerns, the challenges and joys, of ourselves, our community and the world before God each day.

The saying of Morning and Evening Prayer is not just for the clergy but for everyone. We begin our day at 0800 with half an hour of silent prayer, which is followed by Morning Prayer, which usually lasts for about half an hour. We hope to be able to resume the Daily Eucharist very soon. We then come back together at 1700 for Evening Prayer. Everyone is warmly invited to join us for any or all of these times of prayer. You don't have to come everyday, just come when you can or when you want. Praying together is such a powerful thing and such a privilege. Feel free to get in touch if you want to know more. <u>ABBEY BOOKSTALL REOPENING!</u>: We are really pleased to announce that the bookstall is now re-open for business! All we ask is that customers sanitise before browsing. When unattended, payments can be made through the slot on the desk or via the contactless device by the noticeboards.

LIVE STREAMING IS COMING TO THE ABBEY!: The PCC is pleased to inform you that Archdeacon's permission has been granted for a permanent live streaming facility to be installed at the Abbey. This will enable us to share worship, services and other events as they happen across our social media platforms. We have become more aware during the past year of people who are not able to attend church in person, whether that's because of health, frailty or where they live. Live streaming is an important way in which we can connect with those people and with those perhaps exploring faith and church. We are hopeful that our live streaming will be up and running at some point in the summer. If you'd like to get involved with operating the equipment please let us know - full training from our provider will be available. Claire

ST ANDREW'S GRANT WORK STARTS: You will see some work has started at St Andrew's and there will be more happening in the near future. It was awarded just over £59,000 from the Culture Heritage Fund to help it reopen after the Pandemic. Robin Hancox is leading the work to spend the money, which we have to do by the end of June. You might already have noticed the new water butts near the garage and the gravel in the area by the main door. Other work includes a new emergency exit door from the main hall, new gutters, some new carpeting, repointing of the stonework next to the garden and improvements to the internet (this has also been funded for the Abbey). The money will also help us build up our reserves following the loss of income over the last year. We are so pleased to receive this grant and look forward to re-opening our Centre.



CTIP FOODBANK: The Foodbank remains open on Tuesdays 1100 - 1300 and Fridays 1300 - 1500.


Social distancing procedures remain in place with clients being asked to wait in the entrance hall, as guided volunteer.

ATTENDING A PUBLIC WORSHIP SERVICE

It is important that you only attend a public worship service if you feel that it is appropriate and safe for you to do so within the current guidelines.

We understand that some of our congregation are shielding or will not feel able to attend. A digital version of our service sheet is available to assist those who wish to worship at home.

For those who do wish to attend a service, things will be different and our services will be shorter.
