FIRST READING Ezekiel 2:1-5

A reading from the Book of Ezekiel

The heavens were opened, and I saw visions of God. When I saw this, I fell on my face, and I heard the voice of someone speaking. He said to me: O mortal, stand up on your feet, and I will speak with you. And when he spoke to me, a spirit entered into me and set me on my feet; and I heard him speaking to me. He said to me, Mortal, I am sending you to the people of Israel, to a nation of rebels who have rebelled against me; they and their ancestors have transgressed against me to this very day. The descendants are impudent and stubborn. I am sending you to them, and you shall say to them, 'Thus says the Lord GOD.' Whether they hear or refuse to hear (for they are a rebellious house), they shall know that there has been a prophet among them.

SECOND READING 2 Corinthians 12:2-10

A reading from the Second Letter to the Corinthians

I know a person in Christ who fourteen years ago was caught up to the third heaven — whether in the body or out of the body I do not know; God knows. And I know that such a person — whether in the body or out of the body I do not know; God knows — was caught up into Paradise and heard things that are not to be told, that no mortal is permitted to repeat. On behalf of such a one I will boast, but on my own behalf I will not

boast, except of my weaknesses. But if I wish to boast, I will not be a fool, for I will be speaking the truth. But I refrain from it, so that no one may think better of me than what is seen in me or heard from me, even considering the exceptional character of the revelations. Therefore, to keep me from being too elated, a thorn was given me in the flesh, a messenger of Satan to torment me, to keep me from being too elated. Three times I appealed to the Lord about this, that it would leave me, but he said to me, 'My grace is sufficient for you, for power is made perfect in weakness.' So, I will boast all the more gladly of my weaknesses, so that the power of Christ may dwell in me. Therefore I am content with weaknesses, insults, hardships, persecutions, and calamities for the sake of Christ; for whenever I am weak, then I am strong.

THE GOSPEL Mark 6:1-13

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Mark.

Glory to you, O Lord.

Jesus came to his home town, and his disciples followed him. On the sabbath he began to teach in the synagogue, and many who heard him were astounded. They said, 'Where did this man get all this? What is this wisdom that has been given to him? What deeds of power are being done by his hands! Is not this the carpenter, the son of Mary and brother of James and Joses and Judas and Simon, and are not his sisters here with us?' And they took offence at him. Then Jesus said to them, 'Prophets are not without honour, except in their home town, and among their own kin, and in their own house.' And he could do no deed of power there, except that he laid his hands on a few sick people and cured them. And he was amazed at their unbelief.

Then he went about among the villages teaching. He called the twelve and began to send them out two by two, and gave them authority over the unclean spirits. He ordered them to take nothing for their journey except a staff; no bread, no bag, no money in their belts; but to wear sandals and not to put on two tunics. He said to them, 'Wherever you enter a house, stay there until you leave the place. If any place will not welcome you and they refuse to hear you, as you leave, shake off the dust that is on your feet as a testimony against them.' So they went out and proclaimed that all should repent. They cast out many demons, and anointed with oil many who were sick and cured them.

This is the Gospel of the Lord.

Praise to you, O Christ.

REFLECTION BY REVD STEVE DUNTON

I was once mentioned in an article in the national press because I was one of nine of former pupils who had begun working as teachers in their old school. The journalist and article wanted to explore whether this had been difficult for us in any way. I remember the first time that I went into the 'holy of holies', the staffroom and seeing my old teachers sat there, staring at their former pupil now joining their ranks. I wonder what they must have thought?

Most welcomed me and I was soon on first name terms with them but one or two always maintained their reserve around me. I was a young teacher, so some of my pupils were younger siblings of people I had gone to school with, so knew me warts and all. By the time I left teaching for the priesthood, I was teaching the children of people I had gone to school with.

Jesus is invited to preach in the synagogue in his hometown of Nazareth. Mark tells us that the congregation were astounded at his teaching, wisdom, and deeds of power. Instead of being receptive and proud of the local boy 'done good,' instead we are told that they sniped about him, "Is not this the carpenter, the son of Mary? In other words, 'who does he think he is coming here, he's just the local craftsman and we know all about him and his family?'

The Gospel says that the townsfolk 'took offence at him;' him being the local boy, a stumbling block that they were unable to overcome. Sometimes we can be the same. How many of us visit places on holiday but ignore the nice places on our own doorsteps? It is easy for us to dismiss the people that we meet every-day in our ordinary lives, forgetting that God can speak prophetically through them.

God wants us to be agents of his kingdom within the communities in which we live and move. This may be a daunting task. We may feel more comfortable talking of faith with strangers, rather than to those nearest to us. We are afraid that perhaps they know the 'real us,' perhaps too well and therefore be unreceptive to our words.

In today's Gospel, Jesus sends out the twelve on a mission and he wants to sends us out too. He sends the disciples out, seemingly unequipped, instructing them to leave their own resources behind, save for a staff and a pair of sandals. This is to teach them to rely not upon themselves but on God alone.

Likewise, God has equipped us with his authority to speak and act in his name, we merely need to have the courage to try. God's grace will supply the rest. The Holy Spirit often nudges us to speak to someone about faith. Next time, instead of ignoring the nudging, perhaps offer to pray for them or to invite them along to the Abbey. In doing so, we need to trust that we aren't acting alone but that God will speak and act through us.

POST COMMUNION PRAYER

Grant, O Lord, we beseech you, that the course of this world may be so peaceably ordered by your governance, that your Church may joyfully serve you in all godly quietness; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen**

Leading Worship in Church

Lay ministry in the Pershore and Evesham Deanery is thriving in many different ways. Authorised Lay Ministry (ALM) further enables and affirms this. ALM Worship Leaders are one form of authorised lay ministry.

Do you know someone in your parish or benefice who you think might be called to serve as an ALM Worship Leader?

Might it be you who God is asking to take this step?

With encouragement from the Diocese, the Pershore and Evesham Deanery is intending to offer the diocesan ALM Worship Leaders training course in our local area. We want to develop and encourage those who may be called to serve their communities and churches by this ministry.

The training consists of a one-year course. An outline of the modules and an introductory video to the diocesan 2020 course can be found here:

The intention of running the same course locally within our Deanery is to facilitate local support between those training, both through and beyond the duration of the course. It is also hoped that current ALM Worship Leaders will share in ongoing supportive relationships.

Once we know how many are interested, we will plan where the training will be provided, the dates, and for the core days in the programme whether it is preferable to team up with another deanery offering a similar course, to broaden the contexts of ministry.

For the first course, please have this conversation **before Monday 5th July.**

<u>LIVE STREAMING:</u> We have now completed installing equipment in the Abbey to allow us to show our services and other events live over the Internet. We hope this will help people who can't join us in person to be able to be part of our community with a real sense of being there with us. This is an exciting development so please be patient as we test the system over the coming weeks.

<u>ABBEY LIBRARY:</u> The Abbey Library, which can be found next to the bookstall, is now open after an absence of fifteen months. There is a wonderful selection of books that people are very welcome to borrow. We just ask that you sanitise before browsing and sign out any books you want to take away. When you return them can you please put them in a plastic bag, preferably with a date on them, and leave them on the side. Happy reading!

GRANT WORK AT ST ANDREW'S CONTINUES: With the guttering and water butts now complete and broadband available in the building contractors return in July to replace the emergency exit door and the back door. Starting inside will be the installation of new light fittings both in the main hall and the upper room.

Permission is being sought to extend the deadline from June to December due to the difficulties in appointing specialist stonemasons. The Culture Heritage Fund is making a lot of difference to buildings like St Andrew's as we prepare to re-open - we await July 19 with interest.


