FIRST READING Amos 7.7-15

A reading from the Book of Amos

This is what he showed me: the Lord was standing beside a wall built with a plumb-line, with a plumb-line in his hand. And the Lord said to me, 'Amos, what do you see?' And I said, 'A plumb-line.' Then the Lord said, 'See, I am setting a plumb-line in the midst of my people Israel; I will never again pass them by; the high places of Isaac shall be made desolate, and the sanctuaries of Israel shall be laid waste, and I will rise against the house of Jeroboam with the sword.' Then Amaziah, the priest of Bethel, sent to King Jeroboam of Israel, saying, 'Amos has conspired against you in the very centre of the house of Israel; the land is not able to bear all his words. For thus Amos has said, "Jeroboam shall die by the sword, and Israel must go into exile away from his land."' And Amaziah said to Amos, 'O seer, go, flee away to the land of Judah, earn your bread there, and prophesy there; but never again prophesy at Bethel, for it is the king's sanctuary, and it is a temple of the kingdom.' Then Amos answered Amaziah, 'I am no prophet, nor a prophet's son; but I am a herdsman, and a dresser of sycomore trees, and the Lord took me from following the flock, and the Lord said to me, "Go, prophesy to my people Israel."

SECOND READING Ephesians 1.3-14

A reading from the Letter to the Ephesians

Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us in Christ with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly places, just as he chose us in Christ before the foundation of the world to be holy and blameless before him in love. He destined us for adoption as his children through Jesus Christ, according to the good pleasure of his will, to the praise of his glorious grace that he freely bestowed on us in the Beloved. In him we have redemption through his blood, the forgiveness of our trespasses according to the riches of his grace that he lavished on us. With all wisdom and insight he has made known to us the mystery of his will, according to his good pleasure that he set forth in Christ, as a plan for the fullness of time, to gather up all things in Christ, things in heaven and things on earth. In Christ we have also obtained an inheritance, having been destined according to the purpose of him who accomplishes all things according to his counsel and will, so that we, who were the first to set our hope on Christ, might live for the praise of his glory. In him you also, when you had heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation, and had believed in him, were marked with the seal of the promised Holy Spirit; this is the pledge of our inheritance towards redemption as God's own people to the praise of his glory.

THE GOSPEL Mark 6.14-29

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Mark.

Glory to you, O Lord.

King Herod heard of the healings and other miracles, for Jesus' name had become known. Some were saying, 'John the baptizer has been raised from the dead; and for this reason these powers are at work in him.' But others said, 'It is Elijah.' And others said, 'It is a prophet, like one of the prophets of old.' But when Herod heard of it, he said, 'John, whom I beheaded, has been raised.' For Herod himself had sent men who arrested John, bound him, and put him in prison on account of Herodias, his brother Philip's wife, because Herod had married her. For John had been telling Herod, 'It is not lawful for you to have your brother's wife.' And Herodias had a grudge against him, and wanted to kill him. But she could not, for Herod feared John, knowing that he was a righteous and holy man, and he protected him. When he heard him, he was greatly perplexed; and yet he liked to listen to him. But an opportunity came when Herod on his birthday gave a banquet for his courtiers and officers and for the leaders of Galilee. When his daughter Herodias came in and danced, she pleased Herod and his guests; and the king said to the girl, 'Ask me for whatever you wish, and I will give it.' And he solemnly swore to her, 'Whatever you ask me, I will give you, even half of my kingdom.' She went out and said to her mother, 'What should I ask for?' She replied, 'The head of John the Baptist.' Immediately she rushed back to the king and requested, 'I want you to give me at once the head of John the Baptizer on a platter.' The king was deeply grieved; yet out of regard for his oaths and for the guests, he did not want to refuse her. Immediately the king sent a soldier of the guard with orders to bring John's head. He went and beheaded him in the prison, brought his head on a platter, and gave it to the girl. Then the girl gave it to her mother. When his disciples heard about it, they came and took his body, and laid it in a tomb.

This is the Gospel of the Lord.

REFLECTION BY REVD CLAIRE LORDING

If you mention famous godparents, who comes to mind? Perhaps the slightly scary patriarch Vito Corleone from The Godfather film series, or the wonderfully benevolent fairy godmother of Cinderella fame. These are epic characters who are larger than life and certainly have an impact of those around them.

Today is Godparents' Sunday, not a day to remember the godparent figures of film and fiction, but an opportunity to think about those who step up to be godparents. It's the chance to think about those who have been our godparents, those who are still with us and those who have died, but whose influence and love is still felt by us. It's also the chance to think about our godchildren and the commitment we have made to them for the whole of their lives.

We are so blessed in our benefice that we have many baptisms, and this year has been no exception. There are many parents wanting their children to be welcomed into the family of the Church, wanting to somehow say thank you for the safe arrival of their child and wanting to publicly acknowledge the role of particular friends in their child's life as godparents. This is a huge event in the life of a child and their family and we really should give thanks that we are invited to be part of it.

At every baptism service we are reminded that godparents stand up and make special promises, which affect not only the life of their godchild, but also themselves. Godparents promise to pray for their godchild and to help them to follow Christ. This doesn't mean that they can't take their godchild out and have amazing fun, but it does mean that Christ is invited to be at the heart of this very special relationship. Being able to share something of the love that God in Jesus Christ has for each and everyone of us is the most enormous privilege. What better thing can there be of telling a child that they are loved beyond measure and that they are special in the eyes of God.

We remember at baptism services, and on this special day, that being asked to be a godparent is a huge responsibility, and that every godparent needs the love and support of the Christian community, so that they can be the very best sort of godparent possible. It can be challenging being a godparent as it can be an experience filled with more

questions than answers. Physical distance and questions about faith can make it difficult for godparents and godchildren alike, but we know that the effort to keep connected will be worth it. To see a young person flourish in their exploration of faith is incredible. To be able to pray for a godchild is to always keep them close, wherever they are.

Being a godparent is not always straightforward and today's gospel reminds us of the challenges there are of walking a path of faith. John the Baptist, passionate in his faith and his proclamation of Jesus and God's Kingdom, often found himself in tricky situations. His beheading becomes an illustration of the level of threat and discomfort he made people feel and the costly nature of counter cultural faith. Walking a path of faith and encouraging others to do the same is never without risk, you never know how people might respond. Hopefully, being a godparent today would never put godparents at the same level of risk that John the Baptist experienced, but it can be difficult to be bold about faith, prayer and following in the path of Jesus. That's why we have this special day when we can intentionally pray for all godparents and godchildren, that they may encouraged and strengthened in their faith and that our communities of faith may grow and flourish. Amen.

LIVE STREAMING: We have now completed installing equipment in the Abbey to allow us to show our services and other events live over the Internet. We hope this will help people who can't join us in person to be able to be part of our community with a real sense of being there with us. This is an exciting development so please be patient as we test the system over the coming weeks.

GRANT WORK AT ST ANDREW'S CONTINUES: With the guttering and water butts now complete and broadband available in the building contractors return in July to replace the emergency exit door and the back door. Starting inside will be the installation of new light fittings both in the main hall and the upper room.

Permission is being sought to extend the deadline from June to December due to the difficulties in appointing specialist stonemasons. The Culture Heritage Fund is making a lot of difference to buildings like St Andrew's as we prepare to re-open - we await July 19 with interest.

ATTENDING A PUBLIC WORSHIP SERVICE

It is important that you only attend a public worship service if you feel that it is appropriate and safe for you to do so within the current guidelines.
