#### FIRST READING

Jeremiah 23.1-6

A reading from the Prophet Jeremiah

Woe to the shepherds who destroy and scatter the sheep of my pasture! says the Lord. Therefore thus says the Lord, the God of Israel, concerning the shepherds who shepherd my people: It is you who have scattered my flock, and have driven them away, and you have not attended to them. So I will attend to you for your evil doings, says the Lord. Then I myself will gather the remnant of my flock out of all the lands where I have driven them, and I will bring them back to their fold, and they shall be fruitful and multiply. I will raise up shepherds over them who will shepherd them, and they shall not fear any longer, or be dismayed, nor shall any be missing, says the Lord.

The days are surely coming, says the Lord, when I will raise up for David a righteous Branch, and he shall reign as king and deal wisely, and shall execute justice and righteousness in the land. In his days Judah will be saved and Israel will live in safety. And this is the name by which he will be called: 'The Lord is our righteousness.'

#### SECOND READING Ephesians 2.11-22

A reading from the Letter to the Ephesians

Remember that at one time you Gentiles by birth, called 'the uncircumcision' by those who are called 'the circumcision' – a physical circumcision made in the flesh by human hands - remember that you were at that time without Christ, being aliens from the commonwealth of Israel, and strangers to the covenants of promise, having no hope and without God in the world. But now in Christ Jesus you who once were far off have been brought near by the blood of Christ. For he is our peace; in his flesh he has made both groups into one and has broken down the dividing wall, that is, the hostility between us. He has abolished the law with its commandments and ordinances, that he might create in himself one new humanity in place of the two, thus making peace, and might reconcile both groups to God in one body through the cross, thus putting to death that hostility through it. So he came and proclaimed peace to you who were far off and peace to those who were near; for through him both of us have access in one Spirit to the Father. So then you are no longer strangers and aliens, but you are citizens with the saints and also members of the household of God, built upon the foundation of the apostles and prophets, with Christ Jesus himself as the cornerstone. In him the whole structure is joined together and grows into a holy temple in the Lord; in whom you also are built together spiritually into a dwelling-place for God.

#### THE GOSPEL

Mark 6.30-34, 53-56

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Mark.

# Glory to you, O Lord.

The apostles returned from their mission. They gathered around Jesus, and told him all that they had done and taught. He said to them, 'Come away to a deserted place all by yourselves and rest a while.' For many were coming and going, and they had no leisure even to eat. And they went away in the boat to a deserted place by themselves. Now many saw them going and recognized them, and they hurried there on foot from all the towns and arrived ahead of them. As he went ashore, he saw a great crowd; and he had compassion for them, because they were like sheep without a shepherd; and he began to teach them many things.

When they had crossed over, they came to land at Gennesaret and moored the boat. When they got out of the boat, people at once recognized him, and rushed about that whole region and began to bring the sick on mats to wherever they heard he was. And wherever he went, into villages or cities or farms, they laid the sick in the market-places, and begged him that they might touch even the fringe of his cloak; and all who touched it were healed.

This is the Gospel of the Lord.

#### REFLECTION BY PETER STANSBIE (Abbey Reader)

I wonder if you have ever felt out of place somewhere or with some people. Perhaps feeling that you don't belong, that you, or they are 'different'. I can remember feeling like that sometimes, particularly when I was younger. Especially, perhaps, in new situations, new settings.

Usually the feeling passed as I got used to things, but not always.

Now, I am an ordinary sort of person, white, Anglo-Saxon, very British. So it is hard for me to put myself into the shoes of those who are 'different' in any sense. But we have seen in the past week the worst side of how people who are seen as different can be treated. Three brave young men tried to simply score penalties in a game of football but didn't. Nothing unusual in that if you follow the England football team for any time.

They just happened to be men of colour. So they were subjected to awful abuse. In our green and pleasant land, how can this happen? It seems that there are still people out there who somehow think they are superior, better, selected as exclusive in some way.

Sadly there have always been those who feel they are somehow special in the sight of 'their' God. And those who are different to them, in any way, are to be excluded, vilified, hurt, and even destroyed.

Our Gospel today so strongly gives the lie to this. People who wanted his help surround Jesus. And we are told ALL who touched even the fringe of His coat were healed. All, not some, were healed. Not just my tribe, my sect, my nationality, my colour, my sex, my intellect – everyone.

God does not choose who he loves on the basis of strength, power, influence, creed, colour, sexual preference or any other human trait. We are told that we are all made in the image of God. So whatever our image, whatever our choice, whatever our 'being' that must be the image of God. That surely makes us inclusive of everyone, not just those who are like us, like me.

God demands gentleness, kindness, inclusiveness and above all, love, for all.

Of course, that is the challenge for all of us in our lives, in our church, in our faith, in everything we do. I know how hard we work here in the Abbey to be welcoming and inclusive. But as a church we are always called to do more. And the whole church is called to do more.

Some of us have been studying the Living in Love and Faith (LLF) course, which seeks to explore how the Church of England can put the challenge of God to love all into practice. It is a challenging course, it has been for me, but it is a real attempt to find out how we can live with difference, embrace it, and how we need to change our church to be more like what God demands of us. Those of us who have been involved hope and pray that we can lovingly influence the change that is needed.

We are hoping to run more LLF courses in the Autumn, I do encourage you to join in if you can. God's Kingdom here on earth would surely not just recognise the wonderful differences of we humans, but encourage it. That is surely the challenge to us all.

So as we move out of lockdown, carefully and safely, we will meet new people, new challenges, but God wants us to welcome all, however they come to us, whether they simply touch our fringe or fully join this wonderful family of God. As Paul says in his letter to the Ephesians let us welcome all as 'no longer strangers and aliens - but members of the household of God'

God loves us all no matter who or what we are. We are in God's image, all of us, one humanity under one God, who is love.

#### **POST COMMUNION PRAYER**

Lord God, whose Son is the true vine and the source of life, ever giving himself that the world may live: may we so receive within ourselves the power of his death and passion that, in his saving cup, we may share his glory and be made perfect in his love; for he is alive and reigns, now and for ever. **Amen**

**GRANT WORK AT ST ANDREW'S CONTINUES:** With the guttering and water butts now complete and broadband available in the building contractors return in July to replace the emergency exit door and the back door. Starting inside will be the installation of new light fittings both in the main hall and the upper room.

Permission is being sought to extend the deadline from June to December due to the difficulties in appointing specialist stonemasons. The Culture Heritage Fund is making a lot of difference to buildings like St Andrew's as we prepare to re-open - we await July 19 with interest.
