FIRST READING

Jeremiah 11.18-20

It was the Lord who made it known to me, and I knew; then you showed me their evil deeds. But I was like a gentle lamb led to the slaughter. And I did not know it was against me that they devised schemes, saying, 'Let us destroy the tree with its fruit, let us cut him off from the land of the living, so that his name will no longer be remembered!' But you, O Lord of hosts, who judge righteously, who try the heart and the mind, let me see your retribution upon them, for to you I have committed my cause.

SECOND READING

James 3.13-4.3,7-8a

Who is wise and understanding among you? Show by your good life that your works are done with gentleness born of wisdom. But if you have bitter envy and selfish ambition in your hearts, do not be boastful and false to the truth. Such wisdom does not come down

from above, but is earthly, unspiritual, devilish. For where there is envy and selfish ambition, there will also be disorder and wickedness of every kind. But the wisdom from above is first pure, then peaceable, gentle, willing to yield, full of mercy and good fruits, without a trace of partiality or hypocrisy. And a harvest of righteousness is sown in peace for those who make peace.

Those conflicts and disputes among you, where do they come from? Do they not come from your cravings that are at war within you? You want something and do not have it; so you commit murder. And you covet something and cannot obtain it; so you engage in disputes and conflicts. You do not have, because you do not ask. You ask and do not receive, because you ask wrongly, in order to spend what you get on your pleasures. Submit yourselves therefore to God. Resist the devil, and he will flee from you. Draw near to God, and he will draw near to you.

THE GOSPEL

Mark 9.30-37

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Mark.

Glory to you, O Lord.

After leaving the mountain Jesus and his disciples went on from there and passed through Galilee. He did not want anyone to know it; for he was teaching his disciples, saying to them, 'The Son of Man is to be betrayed into human hands, and they will kill him, and three days after being killed, he will rise again.' But they did not understand what he was saying and were afraid to ask him.

Then they came to Capernaum; and when he was in the house he asked them, 'What were you arguing about on the way?' But they were silent, for on the way they had argued with one another who was the greatest. He sat down, called the twelve, and said to them, 'Whoever wants to be first must be last of all and servant of all.' Then he took a little child and put it among them; and taking it in his arms, he said to them, 'Whoever welcomes one such child in my name welcomes me, and whoever welcomes me welcomes not me but the one who sent me.'

These special services will launch our joining the national Parish Giving Scheme.

The scheme is recognised as being a really good way of enabling congregations and supporters to pledge their regular giving to the work and ministry of a church. We are delighted that Chris Boden, the Diocesan Stewardship and Resource Officer, will be joining us for both our Stewardship Sunday services to explain more about the scheme. At our stewardship tea we will have the chance to explain about the Abbey's needs, its plans for the future as we learn to live with Covid, and how your support in time and talents can make a real difference to the ministry which Pershore Abbey can offer our community.


These stewardship services and events will also give us the opportunity to say 'Thank You' for the support so generously given by so many people in the past.

Chris Boden Stewardship & Resources Officer

Dear friends,

I am looking forward to being with you and preaching on the 26th September at Pershore Abbey.

I have recently joined the Diocese of Worcester as your Stewardship and Resources Officer, and I am here to help you and all the churches in the Diocese with looking at your finances and thinking about the generous gifts that you have been given and how you can use these in your mission and ministry. We have been incredibly blessed with some beautiful historic buildings in this Diocese, which are often the only community building remaining in an area; and we can see some great work being done engaging with all generations, from toddler groups to dementia cafes, helping those in need within our communities. The Church of England has a presence in every community, and we want to be there for everyone in their moments of great joy and in their moments of great sadness. However, all this needs funding, and 75% of our income nationally comes from your generous donations.

As part of my visit, we will be launching the Parish Giving Scheme (PGS) at your church. PGS is a national initiative of the Church of England and does not cost your church or your donors anything to be involved; it is a great way that you can regularly and safely give to your church, and has benefits for both the donor and the church. You can choose to give monthly, quarterly, or annually, and your donation is taken by Direct Debit, which guarantees you security through the direct debit guarantee. You can choose for your donation to be Gift Aided, and if you want you can remain anonymous to the church. Also, about 50% of donors opt-in to be reminded annually that they may want to increase their donation in-line with inflation, which massively helps your church keep the value of the donations it receives.

By regularly giving to our churches, we bear witness to the good work they are doing and the proclamation of God's Good News. Our financial offerings are part of our worship, are part of our prayer, and I look forward to coming and being a part of that with you in the near future.
