

REMEMBERING THE FALLEN OF PERSHORE

SPECIAL CENTENARY VIDEO TO COMMEMORATE THE UNVEILING OF PERSHORE'S WAR MEMORIAL



Pershore's War Memorial was unveiled by the 9th Earl of Coventry and dedicated in a service held inside the Abbey on 1st November 1921 held at 1500. Amongst the guests were General Sir Francis Davies, Lt.Col A H Hudson (Chairman of the War Memorial Committee) , Cllr WT Chapman (Chairman of Holy Cross Parish Council) and Alfred Drury the Sculptor along with many ex servicemen and relatives of the Fallen.

The Service includes archived documents, photos, Centenary wreath laying and the Act of Remembrance, and parts will be set to instrumental versions of the hymns they had 100 years ago. The special service will be available on our [You Tube](#) Channel.

This moving and heartfelt video was made possible through the efforts of Trudy Burge - we are very grateful for her tireless work in remembering the fallen of Pershore.

ST ANDREW'S REMEMBERS: If you have been in Pershore and walked past St Andrew's you can't have failed to have seen our magnificent poppy weeping window and our cross dressed with a poppy shroud in memory of the fallen. If you haven't seen it yet, do take a look at this stunning tribute.

Look out for more poppy art over the Remembrance period and don't forget to visit our War Memorial Centenary display in Pershore Abbey




ALL SOULS', ADVENT, CHRISTMAS & MORE!

At the heart of Christmas



'At the heart of Christmas' is the Church of England's theme for Advent and Christmas 2021.

Inspired by readings from the Gospels of Luke and John read at so many Christmas services, At the heart of Christmas is an invitation to everyone to discover – or rediscover – the good news of God's saving love as revealed in the birth of Jesus. It is also a challenge to each of us to ponder in our hearts – as Mary did – what the extraordinary events of the first Christmas might mean for us now and in the years ahead.

At the heart of Christmas is a deliberately simple and open theme – one that the national church hopes can be used by local churches to invite their communities to share in celebrating the good news of Christmas in a whole variety of ways.

As in previous years, there will be a range of digital and print content available, including:

REFLECTIONS: At the heart of Christmas will consist of 12 Stories and Meditations from Justin Welby, Stephen Cottrell and guests where they will share personal stories exploring themes close to the heart of Christmas.

Starting on Christmas Eve and continuing daily (Monday to Saturday) until the Epiphany (6 January), At the Heart of Christmas: 12 Days of stories and meditations for Christmas will help you make space for that exploration. On each of the twelve days, a different contributor will share something that lies close to the heart of Christmas for them, bringing the theme to life through a mixture of personal story, Bible reading, reflection and questions to ponder.

PERSHORE ABBEY NEWS

MORNING PRAISE (SUNDAY PRAISE) CORRECTION: Unfortunately the time of our Morning Praise services is wrong in Abbey Link.

Until Christmas, at the earliest, our half hour Morning Praise (Sunday Praise) service will be held at **1030 in the Abbey. (Not 0930 as pre-Covid)**

We will be reviewing this in the New Year but for the time being please do join us for this service at it's new time, when you can.

PRIVACY IN LIVE STREAMING: We have heard that there is some concern that people may be pictured in the Live Streaming of our services. This is not the case. We have taken steps to ensure that individuals (other than those taking part in the services, of course) will not be visible during the streaming. For example, when Communion is being distributed, we switch to a slide show of images or a photo of a feature in the Abbey. The only people who may be seen, at certain points in the service, are in the front row of pews, but there are notices indicating this is the case. Also, if you have any concerns you can ask one of our wonderful sides people who will seat you somewhere that you are comfortable.

HEALING PRAYERS AT PERSHORE ABBEY: As well as our regular Wholeness and Healing Service on the Second Sunday of the month, the 1030 Sunday Eucharist on the Third Sunday of the month will also offer the opportunity to receive the ministry of healing prayers, with two of the Wholeness & Healing team in the St John Chapel, after communion has been received.



FROM THE DIOCESE

REVD CLAIRE LORDING ELECTED TO THE GENERAL SYNOD: We are pleased to share with you the news that Claire has been elected as one of the new representatives from the Diocese of Worcester to the General Synod for the next five years. She joins Nikki Groarke and Fraser Oates in the House of Clergy, along with three representatives in the House of Laity. We join with the rest of the Diocese in congratulating the successful candidates, and in wishing them well as they represent us at the General Synod.

BISHOP MARTIN'S PILGRIMAGE: Bishop Martin is making a Pilgrimage of Prayer & Hope to the deaneries in the diocese, with the hope of visiting as many parish groups as possible. As part of this pilgrimage Bishop Martin will be presiding at a Eucharist for the whole deanery which will be on **Wednesday 17 November, 1900** at **All Saints, Evesham**. ST ANDREW'S UPDATE

WHY THE SCAFFOLDING AT ST ANDREW'S ? 2021 has seen a lot of work in St Andrew's - some has been funded from the Business grants we received from Wychavon to help get our feet back on the ground; others by fundraising by the Trustees; and some from funding from a Government Culture Fund to help keep our Heritage buildings up to scratch. We thank the people who gave us the grants and our users as these works have progressed - they have had to adapt how they work several times.

The last big chunk of work is to repair the stonework by the back door. This was always going to be challenging - getting the needed permissions, finding the skilled tradesmen and the materials. When the stonemasons started they found the existing stonework was in worse condition than expected. So, work had to stop while they sourced more stone. The good news is that the stone has now been obtained and work will start again soon with completion by December. We are sorry for the inconvenience this is causing but it will be worth it in the end as we again repair this historic building for the future.


