## ADVENT WREATH SONG

We have this Advent Wreath to remind us of the Coming of Jesus, the Light of the World.

The holly and the ivy are dancing in a ring, round the berry bright candles, and the white and shining King.

And one for God's people, in every age and day, we are watching for his coming. We believe and we obey.

We light this candle to help us think of God's greatest promise, first told by the prophets.

O, two is for the prophets and for the light they bring. They are candles in the darkness, all alight for Christ the King.

### THE COLLECT

O Lord, raise up, we pray, your power and come among us, and with great might succour us; that whereas, through our sins and wickedness we are grievously hindered in running the race that is set before us, your bountiful grace and mercy may speedily help and deliver us; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, to whom with you and the Holy Spirit, be honour and glory, now and for ever. **Amen.** 

#### FIRST READING

### Malachi 3.1-4

Thus says the Lord God: See, I am sending my messenger to prepare the way before me, and the Lord whom you seek will suddenly come to his temple. The messenger of the covenant in whom you delight – indeed, he is coming, says the Lord of hosts. But who can endure the day of his coming, and who can stand when he appears? For he is like a refiner's fire and like fullers' soap; he will sit as a refiner and purifier of silver, and he will purify the descendants of Levi and refine them like gold and silver, until they present offerings to the Lord in righteousness. Then the offering of Judah and Jerusalem will be pleasing to the Lord as in the days of old and as in former years.

### SECOND READING Philippians 1.3-11

My brothers and sisters, I thank my God every time I remember you, constantly praying with joy in every one of my prayers for all of you, because of your sharing in the gospel from the first day until now. I am confident of this, that the one who began a good work among you will bring it to completion by the day of Jesus Christ. It is right for me to think this way about all of you, because you hold me in your heart, for all of you share in God's grace with me, both in my imprisonment and in the defence and confirmation of the gospel. For God is my witness, how I long for all of you with the compassion of Christ Jesus. And this is my prayer, that your love may overflow more and more with knowledge and full insight to help you to determine what is best, so that in the day of Christ you may be pure and blameless, having produced the harvest of righteousness that comes through Jesus Christ for the glory and praise of God.

#### THE GOSPEL

Luke 3.1-6

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke

#### Glory to you, O Lord.

In the fifteenth year of the reign of Emperor Tiberius, when Pontius Pilate was governor of Judea, and Herod was ruler of Galilee, and his brother Philip ruler of the region of Ituraea and Trachonitis, and Lysanias ruler of Abilene, during the high-priesthood of Annas and Caiaphas, the word of God came to John son of Zechariah in the wilderness. He went into all the region around the Jordan, proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins, as it is written in the book of the words of the prophet Isaiah, 'The voice of one crying out in the wilderness: "Prepare the way of the Lord, make his paths straight. Every valley shall be filled, and every mountain and hill shall be made low, and the crooked shall be made straight, and the rough ways made smooth; and all flesh shall see the salvation of God.""

# NOVEMBER ABBEY PCC MEETING—NEWS ROUNDUP

Here's a round up of what happened at the November meeting of the Pershore Abbey PCC:

- Many good things are taking off in and around the Abbey. Plans for the Abbey's Eco
  -Wildflower Area are going ahead with the help of the Wychavon. We are grateful
  that Pershore Rotary Club has kindly agreed to fund the purchasing of wildflower
  seeds.
- Our major improvement plan, the ADP (Abbey Development Programme), is progressing well after a site tour and vision evening with the architect, PCC members and advisers. The first stage, the installation of the new organ, should start in June, when a scaffolding arch will be erected temporarily, well clear of the pews. Target completion date is mid-August. Other projects being explored include better refreshment facilities, modern toilets and re-activating the clock and carillon. Funds are being sought.
- The Fabric Committee reported on live-streaming church services, plus work on improving the lighting at the West end.
- The Finance team reported that our funds, though reduced, are adequate thanks to reserves and the return of many paid bookings. We continue to pay our regular Parish Share.
- A busy programme of activities for children and youth is running or planned including Shoebox Sunday, Café Church, Open the Book (in schools) and an Edible Nativity event on 5<sup>th</sup> December.
- St Andrew's is now very busy, so church users were reminded of the need to check available time slots. It now has new doors and carpet but serious roof repairs are on hold till funds are found.
- Our many good works mean there is an increasing need for volunteers to lend a hand, in particular a new treasurer. Please see the Abbey stewardship leaflet for ore information on volunteering opportunities.

The next bi-monthly PCC is planned for **11 January 2022**
