FIRST READING Malachi 3.1-5

A reading from the book of Malachi

Thus says the Lord God: See, I am sending my messenger to prepare the way before me, and the Lord whom you seek will suddenly come to his temple. The messenger of the covenant in whom you delight – indeed, he is coming, says the Lord of hosts. But who can endure the day of his coming, and who can stand when he appears? For he is like a refiner's fire and like fullers' soap; he will sit as a refiner and purifier of silver, and he will purify the descendants of Levi and refine them like gold and silver, until they present offerings to the Lord in righteousness. Then the offering of Judah and Jerusalem will be pleasing to the Lord as in the days of old and as in former years.

Then I will draw near to you for judgement; I will be swift to bear witness against the sorcerers, against the adulterers, against those who swear falsely, against those who oppress the hired workers in their wages, the widow, and the orphan, against those who thrust aside the alien, and do not fear me, says the Lord of hosts.

SECOND READING Hebrews 2.14-18

A reading from the Letter to the Hebrews

Since the children share flesh and blood, Jesus himself likewise shared the same things, so that through death he might destroy the one who has the power of death, that is, the devil, and free those who all their lives were held in slavery by the fear of death. For it is clear that he did not come to help angels, but the descendants of Abraham. Therefore he had to become like his brothers and sisters in every respect, so that he might be a merciful and faithful high priest in the service of God, to make a sacrifice of atonement for the sins of the people. Because he himself was tested by what he suffered, he is able to help those who are being tested.

THE GOSPEL

Luke 2.22-40

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke

Glory to you, O Lord.

When the time came for their purification according to the law of Moses, Mary and Joseph brought Jesus up to Jerusalem to present him to the Lord. (as it is written in the law of the Lord, 'Every firstborn male shall be designated as holy to the Lord'), and they offered a sacrifice according to what is stated in the law of the Lord, 'a pair of turtle-doves or two young pigeons.'

Now there was a man in Jerusalem whose name was Simeon; this man was righteous and devout, looking forward to the consolation of Israel, and the Holy Spirit rested on him. It had been revealed to him by the Holy Spirit that he would not see death before he had seen the Lord's Messiah. Guided by the Spirit, Simeon came into the temple; and when the parents brought in the child Jesus, to do for him what was customary under the law, Simeon took him in his arms and praised God, saying, 'Master, now you are dismissing your servant in peace, according to your word; for my eyes have seen your have prepared the all salvation, which you in presence of peoples, a light for revelation to the Gentiles and for glory to your people Israel.'

And the child's father and mother were amazed at what was being said about him. Then Simeon blessed them and said to his mother Mary, 'This child is destined for the falling and the rising of many in Israel, and to be a sign that will be opposed so that the inner thoughts of many will be revealed – and a sword will pierce your own soul too.' There was also a prophet, Anna the daughter of Phanuel, of the tribe of Asher. She was of a great age, having lived with her husband seven years after her marriage, then as a widow to the age of eighty-four. She never left the temple but worshipped there with fasting and prayer night and day. At that moment she came, and began to praise God and to speak about the child to all who were looking for the redemption of Jerusalem. When they had finished everything required by the law of the Lord, they returned to Galilee, to their own town of Nazareth. The child grew and became strong, filled with wisdom; and the favour of God was upon him.

This is the Gospel of the Lord. **Praise to you, O Christ.**

Lord, you fulfilled the hope of Simeon and Anna, who lived to welcome the Messiah: may we, who have received these gifts beyond words, prepare to meet Christ Jesus when he comes to bring us to eternal life; for he is alive and reigns, now and for ever. **Amen.**

A NEW PIPE ORGAN FOR PERSHORE ABBEY IN 2022

Pershore Abbey has been planning and fundraising for the purchase and installation of a new pipe organ since the old Walker/Nicholson pipe organ was removed from the Abbey during the 1996 restoration of the Abbey and temporarily replaced by the Bradford electronic organ. The outcome of the research and endeavours of the Parochial Church Council (PCC) especially during the past seven years is at last to come to fruition and we are pleased to announce that the new organ is to be installed during this coming Summer.

The new organ is being built by Fratelli Ruffatti, an internationally renowned family organ builder based in Padua, Italy, and selected from some eight organ builders based in the UK and across Western Europe. It will be delivered to the Abbey for installation and voicing between June and August 2022.

The new organ is designed so that it will be not only enable us to have beautiful music at all of our services, but it will also allow many different types of concert and musical events to take place in the Abbey.

This project has been seriously delayed because of the travel restrictions between Italy and the UK caused by Covid 19 - our original plan was to install the organ during the Summer of 2021. However, visitors to the Abbey will note that we have installed two platforms to support the organ casings and much enabling work took place during 2020 in the roof space behind the platforms to create a blower room. We have also installed a new ladder to the blower room to provide access for tuning and maintenance of the organ once installed.

The installation of the organ and associated work is due to commence on 22 May when a major scaffolding structure will be built across the central aisles of the Abbey to support a working platform from which the Fratelli Ruffatti craftsmen will build the organ casings. The component parts of the organ will be stored carefully in the south transept until they are required and suitable hoists and lifting equipment will be installed to raise the various items. It is anticipated that the construction of the organ and blower room will take place from early June until mid-July. The major scaffolding will then be removed to allow the voicing (tuning) of the organ to take place. Voicing is an extremely specialist task that requires complete silence in the Abbey. It is likely to take about five weeks to complete and it will be necessary to close the Abbey during this final and most sensitive part of the organ installation.

The whole installation process will be overseen by Robert Kilgour, Abbey Architect, Clive Haywood, Abbey Structural Engineer, and Matthew Martin, Abbey Organ Advisor, and when they and they and the PCC are content with all aspects of the installation, the organ will be formally handed over for acceptance by the Abbey. Plans are in hand to arrange a formal launch service for the new organ at that time.

During the whole of the installation process there will inevitably be times when there is restricted access to parts of the Abbey. We ask regular users and visitors to the Abbey to bear with us during this time. There will, of course, be interruptions to work activity to allow normal services to take place.

We are naturally delighted that this exciting organ project is shortly to be realised and look forward to the benefits that this new, powerful and versatile instrument will bring to the Abbey congregation and the wider community for generations to come.

The PCC is most grateful for the financial support provided especially by the Friends of Pershore Abbey CIO and those members of the congregation and wider community who have made donations towards the organ pipes. This project would not have been possible without this most generous support.
