Iona Evening prayers - Human Rights 7.30pm 26th May 2021

Welcome and Introduction:

Reading: 'Prayer with the World Church – Black Lives matter' by USPG:

On 25th May 2020, George Floyd died in the city of Minneapolis, USA, as a result of police brutality. His death was a shocking sight and news of his passing spread quickly. Alongside other victims of police brutality, such as Michael Brown Jr. Breonna Taylor and Trayvon Martin, Floyd's name has become a powerful symbol of the systemic injustice that people of colour face throughout their lives.

As Trayvon Martin's death in Florida in 2012 led to the formation of the Black Lives Matter movement, the killing of George Floyd resulted in the resurgence and the growth of Black Lives Matter. The summer of 2020 saw anti-racist protests worldwide, from the US and the UK to Japan and Brazil. These protests raised a huge amount of awareness of racism and the ways in which racism pervades society. They even led to changes in American law, particularly in police departments in major cities. However, there is still much work to be done to combat racism in all its forms around the world including the UK.

Leader: We pray that your law of unselfish love for one another should be the norm by which we all should live.

(PAUSE) God our Father,

ALL: LET YOUR KINGDOM COME.

Leader: We pray now for people in any form of trouble, mental or physical illness, sorrow, need or suffering of any kind, and we think of those who feel alienated from their communities because of race or religion. Those seeking refuge from war and natural disaster and economic oppression. *(PAUSE)* God our Father,

ALL: LET YOUR KINGDOM COME.

Leader: We pray for ourselves, that we may have the will and wisdom to be the answer to at least some of our

prayers. (PAUSE) God our Father,

ALL: LET YOUR KINGDOM COME.

Song: All the wonder that surrounds us springs from God's care:

All that marvels or confounds us, raw, rich or rare;

Touch and texture, sights and voices, nature's countless forms and choices:

All for which the heart rejoices, springs from God's care.

Every creature, every human lives by God's grace:

Every family, man and woman, culture and race;

Those whom fortune seems to favour, those exploited for their labour,

Those who need to know a neighbour live by God's grace.

How can we revere God's goodness meant for all time?

How ensure that each uniqueness keeps in its prime?

How can we revere with pleasure all God gives for life and leisure?
