<u>AUXILIARY PATHWAY:</u> We are delighted to announce that Penny Gordon, churchwarden at St Mary's, Wick, who, after much reflecting and thinking on who it is that God is calling her to be, has been recommended to start what is called the Diocesan Auxiliary Pathway. This is a way that people can train to become locally focussed ordained ministers. In September Penny will begin a two year part-time training course delivered by the Diocese. During the two years, Penny will explore her vocation to



ordained ministry alongside theological learning and will need to pass a national selection process before she can be ordained in the Diocese. These are exciting times for Penny and St Mary's. Please pray for Penny, Mike and everyone at St Mary's as they go on this incredible journey. *Claire*

<u>LITTER PICK AND PLASTICS:</u> On Saturday 13 July 12 Litter Pickers got together, 8 did the usual 1000 Litter Pick and 2 more joined us in St Andrew's afterwards where Suzanne Clark and Sandra Long had prepared tea and cake plus informative YouTube clips on plastic recycling.

Plastic is really useful but comes at a cost. It is getting into all oceans and 60% of dolphins and whales are thought affected. Some countries are acting, Peru passed a





law to keep plastic out of national parks, the EU has brought in single use plastics (SUP) regulations. We found that not all plastic can be recycled and takes hundreds of years to break down. The logo chosen by the industry for designating plastic type is very like the recycling symbol but it is rare in the UK or elsewhere to recycle numbers 3, 4, 6 and 7. The United Nations identifies less than 10% of plastic is recycled worldwide. Even then one video called it 'downcycling' as recycling plastic is only possible a few times as it degrades. On current trends 4 times the plastic ever produced will be created between now and 2050. So recycling is not the main

answer. National level action is needed, such as in Netherland which has passed laws on recycling and the 'circular economy'. In 'circular economy' thinking unless there is a use for an item after its first use it is not created. *David Oldham*






