Welcome and Introduction:

Gathering Song: **☐** God welcomes all, strangers and friends.

God's love is strong and it never ends. (x3)

Opening Responses:

Leader: Creator of community,

All: we gather as our journeys meet.

Leader: Generous and inclusive friend,

All: we rejoice in our friendship here.

Leader: Lover of laughter and song,

All: we offer these to you.

Leader: Giver of our daily bread,

All: we thank you for all that nourishes us.

Leader: God, our constant Companion,

<u>Bible Reading:</u> (John 6 verses 1 - 13 Jesus feeds the five thousand)

Reader: Listen now to the Word of God.

Sometime after this, Jesus crossed to the far shore of the Sea of Galilee (that is, the Sea of Tiberias), ² and a great crowd of people followed him because they saw the signs he had performed by healing the sick. ³ Then Jesus went up on a mountainside and sat down with his disciples. ⁴ The Jewish Passover Festival was near.

⁵ When Jesus looked up and saw a great crowd coming toward him, he said to Philip, "Where shall we buy bread for these people to eat?" ⁶ He asked this only to test him, for he already had in mind what he was going to do.

⁷Philip answered him, "It would take more than half a year's wages to buy enough bread for each one to have a bite!"

⁸ Another of his disciples, Andrew, Simon Peter's brother, spoke up, ⁹ "Here is a boy with five small barley loaves and two small fish, but how far will they go among so many?"

¹⁰ Jesus said, "Have the people sit down." There was plenty of grass in that place, and they sat down (about five thousand men were there). ¹¹ Jesus then took the loaves,

gave thanks, and distributed to those who were seated as much as they wanted. He did the same with the fish.

¹² When they had all had enough to eat, he said to his disciples, "Gather the pieces that are left over. Let nothing be wasted." ¹³ So they gathered them and filled twelve baskets with the pieces of the five barley loaves left over by those who had eaten.
