'PEACE BUT NOT SILENCE' - IONA SERVICE: The next Iona Service will be taking place at 1700 on Sunday 24 November in the Abbey. As a response to the trauma and despair that many of us are feeling about the horrors of conflict around the world, November's service is focussing on peace. Not snow-covered Christmas card peace, rather the

challenging deep 'Shalom' or 'Salaam' of peace with justice. We'll be taking a mini-pilgrimage using reflections by the leader of the lona Community, Ruth Harvey. The themes of stations on the route will progress from inner conflict and peace, through reconciliation and the power of listening, to becoming peacemakers in the world. There'll be time for sharing thoughts and possible practical actions, as well as some refreshments. Don't forget, there's no Iona Service in December, it will return on 26 January 2025. EVERYDAY FAITH APP: Everyday Faith is the new daily devotional app from the Church of England designed to inspire, equip and encourage you in your faith every day of the week, not just on Sundays. The idea is twofold. The app forms part of one of the Church of England's



objectives of missional discipleship: "To become a church of missionary disciples where all God's people are free to live the Christian life, wherever we spend our time Sunday to Saturday." But the app also responds to overwhelming demand from our users for an app that delivers inspirational reflections year-round rather than focussed on seasonal content during Lent and Advent. Everyday Faith is now available to download for iOS and Android—visit your app store. If you already have the Watch & Pray app installed, you will automatically get the update.

WORLD AIDS DAY: World AIDS Day is a global movement to unite people in the fight against HIV and AIDS. Since 1988, communities have stood together on World AIDS Day to show strength and solidarity against HIV stigma and to remember lives lost. In the UK, more than 105,000 people are living with HIV. Medical advances mean people with HIV in the UK can expect a long and healthy life and that we have the tools to stop HIV transmissions for good. But HIV continues to be highly stigmatised and misunderstood. World AIDS Day exists to shine a light on the real experiences of



people living with HIV today, while celebrating the strength, resilience and diversity of the communities most affected. Red ribbons are available at the back of the Abbey. Please consider showing your support and wearing a ribbon on the days around 01 December.

REMEMBERING CYRIL BENTON GLOVER

About 15 years ago in St Nicholas Church, Pinvin, during the 2 minute silence at Remembrance Day service, we found ourselves reading the names on the memorial. We really knew nothing of the lives of these men who gave everything for our freedom so decided that we should research them and commemorate them in a more personal way. We



have tried to visit as many of the graves or memorials of these local lads as we can to lay a flower or poppy. Some we will likely never be able to visit in places like Basra but most can be found in France and Belgium.

We have just returned from our holiday in France this year and as we passed through Abbeville, we took a diversion to the extension of the Abbeville Communal Cemetery to pay our respects to another of the Pinvin fallen. The war cemetery is up on a hill overlooking the town and as with all Commonwealth War Graves Commission sites, it is brilliantly cared for.



This time the grave we were visiting was that of Cyril Benton Glover. Cyril was born in 1898 in Peopleton. By the 1911 census, he was working as a plough boy and living with Ann Glover, his grandmother, and elder brother, Percy, in Seaford Grange Cottage, just north of Pinvin. He was a Private in the 8th battalion of the 2nd Worcestershire regiment. He was killed at the age of 19 on the Somme on 12 February 1917.

From regimental records around that time "......the 2nd Worcestershire, closer to the line, were rehearsing for a smaller operation. Throughout the first weeks in February the Battalion held trenches just north of the Somme or billets behind that line. Battalion were in the frontline January 31 to February 5. Casualties; 6 wounded.In the middle of the month orders were received for an organised raid on the opposing trenches, to discover the identity of the German troops."



It is not known exactly how or where Cyril died but he, like so many others, served his country and paid the ultimate price and will be remembered in Pinvin and Peopleton where he is commemorated on both Memorials. *Jill and Rob Mustard*




