THE COLLECT

Eternal Father, who at the baptism of Jesus revealed him to be your Son, anointing him with the Holy Spirit: grant to us, who are born again by water and the Spirit, that we may be faithful to our calling as your adopted children; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen.**

FIRST READING

Isaiah 43.1-7

A reading from the Prophet Isaiah

Thus says the Lord, he who created you, O Jacob, he who formed you, O Israel: Do not fear, for I have redeemed you; I have called you by name, you are mine. When you pass through the waters, I will be with you; and through the rivers, they shall not overwhelm you; when you walk through fire you shall not be burned, and the flame shall not consume you. For I am the Lord your God, the Holy One of Israel, your Saviour. I give Egypt as your ransom, Ethiopia and Seba in exchange for you. Because you are precious in my sight, and honoured, and I love you, I give people in return for you, nations in exchange for your life. Do not fear, for I am with you; I will bring your offspring from the east, and from the west I will gather you; I will say to the north, 'Give them up', and to the south, 'Do not withhold; bring my sons from far away and my daughters from the end of the earth — everyone who is called by my name, whom I created for my glory, whom I formed and made.'

SECOND READING

Acts 8.14-17

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

When the apostles at Jerusalem heard that Samaria had accepted the word of God, they sent Peter and John to them. The two went down and prayed for them that they might receive the Holy Spirit (for as yet the Spirit had not come upon any of them; they had only been baptized in the name of the Lord Jesus). Then Peter and John laid their hands on them, and they received the Holy Spirit.

THE GOSPEL

Luke 3.15-17,21-22

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke.

Glory to you, O Lord.

In the wilderness John proclaimed a baptism of repentance. As the people were filled with expectation, and all were questioning in their hearts concerning John, whether he might be the Messiah, John answered all of them by saying, 'I baptize you with water; but one who is more powerful than I is coming; I am not worthy to untie the thong of his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire. His winnowing-fork is in his hand, to clear his threshing-floor and to gather the wheat into his granary; but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire.'

Now when all the people were baptized, and when Jesus also had been baptized and was praying, the heaven was opened, and the Holy Spirit descended upon him in bodily form like a dove. And a voice came from heaven, 'You are my Son, the Beloved; with you I am well pleased.'

This is the Gospel of the Lord. **Praise to you, O Christ.**

SUMMARY OF ABBEY PCC HELD ON 7 JANUARY 2025

Music

James MacDowall Scott our Director of Music attended to talk about his plans and progress with the choir. He hopes that over the next 3 years we can further expand our excellent choir, continue and expand our organ workshops, hold more organ recitals with some outside organists, hold further Evensong services with visiting choirs adding to our own and develop a junior choir with local schools.

We will also look at the possibility of finding a young organ scholar who can help James with services.

We agreed that we would approach the Friends to purchase some additional new robes for our increasing choir.

James was thanked for his enthusiasm and asked to pass on our thanks to the choir for their excellent work, especially at Christmas.

Foodbank

We heard that the foodbank had been extremely busy over the Christmas period but with amazing support from donors had managed to cope with the extra demand. A representative from the Abbey to join the Steering Group is needed to replace Judy Dale who is standing down. Please let Claire know if you would be interested.

Fabric

We have now received the go-ahead to start work on maintaining and improving the outside area around the old Font. We are now working with our Architect to resolve the design and obtain any approvals.
